17	WHEREAS, the tremendously successful political consultant Jerry Lewis						
18	Russell, Jr., born July 21, 1933, in Little Rock, Arkansas, died in Little						
19	Rock on December 5, 2003, at the age of seventy (70); and

21	WHEREAS, Russell was a loving husband to Alice Anne Cason Russell, a						
22	loving father to Leigh Anne Russell, Jerry L. "Sam" Russell, III, Susan						
23	Frances Russell, and Andrew J. Russell, III, a loving grandfather to Chris						
24	Russell, Andrew J. Russell, IV, Ethan Lewis Russell, Marc Miller, D.A.						
25	Miller, and Sarah Broaddrick, and a loving great grandfather to Bethany Anne						
26	Russell; and

28	WHEREAS, Russell served his country faithfully in the Korean Conflict;

31	WHEREAS, Jerry Russell was a master of both the written and spoken						
32	word, a champion of history, and frequent ally to the political underdog; and

34	WHEREAS, Russell put on workshops for political candidates and made						
35	presentations on political topics to audiences nationwide; and

1	WHEREAS, Russell, a former columnist for the Arkansas Democrat, edited
2	and published a monthly informational letter called Grass Roots Campaigning
3	about political techniques, psychology, and philosophy; Short Takes, a
4	monthly newsletter about media, politics, advertising, and people in
5	Arkansas; and three (3) historical newsletters; and wrote a monthly column,
6	"Grass Roots Campaigning", in the Kentucky Gazette; and
7	
8	WHEREAS, Russell was also extremely active in the preservation and
9	protection of Civil War and Indian War historic sites, served as founder and
10	chairman of numerous historical societies such as The Confederate Historical
11	Institute and Civil War Round Table Associates, and has been honored by
12	organizations throughout the United States for his leadership on behalf of
13	Civil War historic preservation; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, Russell was a highly successful political consultant and
16	trusted confidant to candidates he determined had the toughness and
17	commitment to run for political office, winning over seventy percent (70%) of
18	his races; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, Russell consistently reminded us that "all politics is local",
21	and that public service is a high calling; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, Russell changed the way political campaigns were run and will
24	forever be remembered for his campaign jingles that we could not help but
25	recall again and again during election season; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, Russell was a giant among political animals, political
28	consultants, political educators, political historians, and political
29	writers,
30	
31	NOW THEREFORE,
32	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL
