9	COMMEMORATING THE FORTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE
10	SURGEON GENERAL'S REPORT ON SMOKING AND HEALTH.

12	Subtitle
13	COMMEMORATING THE FORTIETH ANNIVERSARY
14	OF THE SURGEON GENERAL'S REPORT ON
15	SMOKING AND HEALTH.
16	
17	
18	WHEREAS, January 11, 2004, marks the fortieth anniversary of the
19	Surgeon General's landmark report on smoking and health; and
20	
21	WHEREAS, the report was the first widely-publicized official
22	recognition that cigarette smoking is a cause of cancer and other serious and
23	deadly diseases; and
24	THIRD TAG
25	WHEREAS, an estimated nineteen thousand seven hundred (19,700) Arkansas
26	citizens die prematurely each year from tobacco-related illnesses and one-
27 28	third $(1/3)$ of all cancer deaths are tobacco-related; and
29	WHEREAS, secondhand smoke is the third (3rd) leading preventable cause
30	of death in the United States, killing thirty-eight thousand (38,000) to
31	sixty-five thousand (65,000) nonsmokers every year; and
32	sixty live thousand (05,000) honomorers every year, and
33	WHEREAS, cigarette smoking in the United States causes about thirty
34	percent (30%) of cancer deaths and four hundred forty thousand (440,000)
35	premature deaths annually; and
36	

1	WHEREAS, an estimated \$157 billion in annual health-related economic
2	losses are attributable to smoking; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, many of the detrimental effects of smoking can be prevented or
5	reversed by quitting smoking; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, smokers who quit by age thirty-five (35) avoid ninety percent
8	(90%) of the risk attributable to tobacco; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, smoking cessation programs provide large health care benefits
11	at a low cost, and the estimated savings from reduced health care costs pay
12	for cessation efforts in three (3) to four (4) years; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, smoking among adults decreased by an average of one percent
15	(1%) per year from 1993 to 2000; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, although smoking is the most preventable cause of death, in
18	1995 two million (2,000,000) people died from smoking-related diseases; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, tobacco use in the United States is responsible for nearly one
21	(1) in five (5) deaths,
22	
23	NOW THEREFORE,
24	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL
25	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
26	
27	THAT the House of Representatives of the Eighty-Fourth General Assembly
28	of the State of Arkansas honors the fortieth anniversary of the landmark
29	Surgeon General's report on smoking and health, which widely publicized the
30	dangerous and often deadly effects of smoking.
