28	WHEREAS, Easter Seals now provides a comprehensive range of services
29	from early childhood education to medical rehabilitation to job training and
30	placement to assisted and independent living programs; and

32	WHEREAS, Easter Seals was the first program in Arkansas to provide a
33	preschool for children with and without disabilities; and

35	WHEREAS, Easter Seals provides an Early Head Start program for children
36	from birth to age three; and

2	WHEREAS, Easter Seals provides statewide outreach services for
3	technology assistance and training, educational evaluation, training, and
4	consultation for students in Arkansas' school districts; and

6	WHEREAS, Easter Seals provides the state's only inpatient medical
7	rehabilitation center for children; and

9	WHEREAS, Easter Seals served over 7,836 Arkansans last year,

11	NOW THEREFORE,
12	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL
13	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
