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3 4 SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 5 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 6 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and 7 8 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 9 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 10 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 11 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 12 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 13 14 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 15 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 16 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 17 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 18 19 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 20 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 21 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 22 23 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 24 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 25 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 26 effectiveness of this Act on the date of its passage and approval is 27 essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this 28 Act are provided, and that in the event of a Special Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond the date of its passage and approval 29 30 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared 31 32 to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the 33 public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and 34 after the date of its passage and approval. 35 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor 36
