9	(2) Implementation of a training plan, including, but not

27	information defining the type of preventive maintenance work performed and		
28	the completion date;		
29	(2) Development and implementation of a work-request system to		
30	allow others to inform the maintenance department of needs and to allow the		
31	responsible person to prioritize responses;		
32	(3) Opportunities for selected maintenance employees to attend		
33	continuing in-service training provided regionally by the authority of the		
34	office of School Plant Services of the Department of Education; and		
35	(4) Compliance with federal, state, county, and municipal laws		
36	and regulations regarding school facilities.		

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1	(e) For the standards for preventive maintenance care, the state board		
2	shall consider the inclusion of the following:		
3	(1) Inspection, cleaning, and servicing of heating, ventilation,		
4	and air-conditioning systems;		
5	(2) Inspection and repair of electrical systems;		
6	(3) Inspection of hot water boilers and heaters;		
7	(4) Inspection of fire alarms;		
8	(5) Inspection and servicing of fire sprinkler systems;		
9	(6) Inspection of fire extinguishers and kitchen hood vent		
10	suppression systems;		
11	(7) Inspection of emergency lighting and exit light fixtures;		
12	(8) Inspection of elevators and wheel chair lifts;		
13	(9) Inspection of plumbing;		
14	(10) Inspection of roofs;		
15	(11) Inspection of stairwell areas;		
16	(12) Inspection of floor coverings;		
17	(13) Inspection of masonry and concrete buildings exteriors;
