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2	(c) For the standards for custodial care, the state board shall
3	consider the inclusion of the following:
4	(1)(A) Implementation of a custodial care plan for all
5	facilities owned by a district.
6	(B) This plan shall incorporate a schedule of routine care
7	and renovation cleaning;
8	(2) Implementation of a training plan, including, but not
9	<pre>limited to:</pre>
10	(A) Chemical right-to-know;
11	(B) Indoor air quality;
12	(C) Blood-borne pathogens;
13	(D) Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1986, 20
14	U.S.C. § 4011, two-hour asbestos, low-pressure boiler operator, safety codes
15	and procedures;
16	(E) Crisis management;
17	(F) District employment policies;
18	(G) Routine care procedures;
19	(H) Renovation cleaning procedures;
20	(I) Supply procurement procedures; and
21	(J) Minor maintenance procedures and equipment use and
22	care procedures;
23	(3)(A) Provisions for adequate supplies and equipment to perform
24	the custodial care plan.
25	(B) Adequate space shall be provided for the proper
26	storage of these supplies and equipment.
27	(C) Appropriate training for the use and storage of all
28	supplies and equipment, with emphasis given to chemical right-to-know, indoor
29	air quality, and other applicable standards;
30	(4) Opportunities for custodial employees to attend continuing
31	in-service training provided and held regionally by the authority of the
32	office of School Plant Services of the Department of Education.

21	(d) For the standards for maintenance care, the state board shall
22	consider the inclusion of the following:
23	(1)(A) Development and implementation of a scheduled preventive
24	maintenance plan for all facilities owned by a district.
25	(B) This plan shall include documentation and retention of
26	information defining the type of preventive maintenance work performed and
27	the completion date;
28	(2) Development and implementation of a work-request system to
29	allow others to inform the maintenance department of needs and to allow the
30	responsible person to prioritize responses;
31	(3) Opportunities for selected maintenance employees to attend
32	continuing in-service training provided regionally by the authority of the
33	office of School Plant Services of the Department of Education; and
34	(4) Compliance with federal, state, county, and municipal laws
35	and regulations regarding school facilities.
36	(e) For the standards for preventive maintenance care, the state board

1	shall consider the inclusion of the following:
2	(1) Inspection, cleaning, and servicing of heating, ventilation,
3	and air-conditioning systems;
4	(2) Inspection and repair of electrical systems;
5	(3) Inspection of hot water boilers and heaters;
6	(4) Inspection of fire alarms;
7	(5) Inspection and servicing of fire sprinkler systems;
8	(6) Inspection of fire extinguishers and kitchen hood vent
9	suppression systems;
10	(7) Inspection of emergency lighting and exit light fixtures;
11	(8) Inspection of elevators and wheel chair lifts;
12	(9) Inspection of plumbing;
13	(10) Inspection of roofs;
14	(11) Inspection of stairwell areas;
15	(12) Inspection of floor coverings;
16	(13) Inspection of masonry and concrete buildings exteriors;
17	(14) Inspection of kitchen equipment;
18	(15) Maintenance of a pest control program;
19	(16) Inspection of sidewalks, driveways, parking areas, and
20	paved play areas;
21	(17) Inspection of parking lots, handicap parking spaces,
22	driveways, fire and emergency vehicle zones, and bus and car loading and
23	unloading areas;
24	(18) Inspection of playground equipment; and
25	(19) Establishment of a grounds maintenance program.
