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## For An Act To Be Entitled

 AN ACT TO CREATE A COMMITTEE ON OPPORTUNITY, EQUITY, AND FAIRNESS WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.
## Subtitle

AN ACT TO CREATE A COMMITTEE ON
OPPORTUNITY, EQUITY, AND FAIRNESS WITHIN
THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 25, Chapter 6, Subchapter 1 is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

25-6-107. Committee on Opportunity, Equity, and Fairness.
(a) As used in this section:
(1) "Clearinghouse" means an office that:
(A) Mediates between the State Board of Education or the Department of Education and school districts concerning opportunity, equity, and fairness in the public schools; and
(B) In matters concerning opportunity, equity, and fairness in public schools, ensures that:
(i) All proper procedures and protocols are followed in handling the mediation;
(ii) Information related to the mediation is
disseminated efficiently and effectively to all parties; and
(iii) All parties clearly and fully understand the process, the law, and their rights under the law; and
(2) "Minority school" means a school in which sixty percent ( $60 \%$ ) or more of the average daily membership are minority students as defined in § 1-2-503.
(b) There is created the Committee on Opportunity, Equity, and Fairness in Education to be housed within the department.
(c) The committee shall:
(1) Ensure that decisions by the state board and the department include a concern for impacts on minority populations;
(2) Serve as an advocate for minority schools, students, parents, and communities;
(3) Review grant-making, rule-making, and enforcement actions to ensure that state board and department decisions are made without bias towards race, socioeconomic class, gender, geography, or religion;
(4) Serve as a clearinghouse for grievances, conflicts, and disputes between the state board or the department and school districts and between local school districts and parents or students if the local grievance procedure did not resolve an issue on opportunity, equity, and fairness issues;
(5) Ensure that each school district in the state has a wellpublicized local grievance procedure for opportunity, equity, and fairness complaints between parents or students and the school or school district;
(6) Review teacher hiring practices statewide to ensure goodfaith efforts of schools statewide to hire teachers from the same demographic groups as their students; and
(7) Review the development and maintenance by the state board and the department of programs to recruit and retain minority teachers.
(d) The state board and the department shall cooperate with the committee in carrying out the purposes of this section.
(e) The committee shall be composed of the following members:
(1) Three (3) members appointed by the Governor, with no more than one (1) member residing in the same congressional district and with at least one (l) member being a parent or guardian of a child currently enrolled in an Arkansas public school;
(2) Three (3) members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, with no more than one (l) member residing in the same congressional district and with at least one (1) member being a parent or

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guardian of a child currently enrolled in an Arkansas public school;
    (3) Three (3) members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
the Senate, with no more than one (1) member residing in the same
congressional district and with at least one (l) member being a parent or
guardian of a child currently enrolled in an Arkansas public school; and
    (4) A nonvoting member representing the office of the Attorney
General.
    (f) The Director of the Department of Education shall call the first
meeting of the committee no more than sixty (60) days after the effective
date of this section.
    (g) At the first meeting, the members shall elect a chair who shall
serve a one-year term.
    (h) A majority of the members of the committee shall constitute a
quorum to transact the business of the committee.
    (i)(1) The committee shall meet at least semi-annually in the offices
of the department or at such other locations as the committee shall
determine.
            (2) The department shall provide staff and office space for the
committee.
    (j) Each member of the committee may receive expense reimbursement and
stipends in accordance with § 25-16-902.
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
