22	WHEREAS, Mr. Lloyd Kennedy of Harrison, Arkansas, died on Friday,
23	December 12, 2003, at the age of eighty years; and
24	
25	WHEREAS, Mr. Kennedy was born in Cardin, Oklahoma, was a graduate of
26	Pitcher High School, and then joined the U.S. Navy, serving three years in
27	the South Pacific during World War II; and
28	
29	WHEREAS, Mr. Kennedy was a graduate of Utah State College in Logan,
30	Utah, and thereafter entered the U.S. Air Force as a 2nd Lieutenant; and
31	
32	WHEREAS, Mr. Kennedy received his pilot's wings in 1951, serving in the
33	Strategic Air Command, and won a World Bombing competition flying B-47
34	bombers in 1956; and
35	
36	WHEREAS. Mr. Kennedy became a test and evaluation officer for the Titan

1	II Missile Weapon System in 1961, and retired from the Air Force in 1971; and
2	
3	WHEREAS, Mr. Kennedy relocated to Ponca, Arkansas, in 1971, owned and
4	operated the Lost Valley Lodge, and developed and served as president of the
5	first Buffalo Canoe Renter's Association; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, Mr. Kennedy served as director of the Northwest Arkansas Area
8	Agency on Aging from 1973 until 1990, and was instrumental in the development
9	of the first hospice and adult day care in Arkansas; he served under three
10	Arkansas governors as president of the Arkansas Governors Advisory Council on
11	Aging; he was the state coordinator for the National Senior Olympic Games and
12	chairman of the Arkansas Senior Olympics; and he helped develop the Ms.
13	Senior Arkansas pageant; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, Mr. Kennedy is survived by his wife of 53 years, Patricia
16	Kennedy, two daughters, Peggy Bonds and Diana Brasel, two sons, Michael
17	Kennedy and James Kennedy, five grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren;

21	publicly recognize Mr. Kennedy's many contributions to the U.S. Military, the
