22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

24	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 18 is amended to add an
25	additional subchapter to read as follows:
26	6-18-1301. Vision screenings.
27	(a)(1) Beginning with the 2006-2007 school year, all children in pre-
28	kindergarten (pre-K), kindergarten (k), grades one (1), two (2), four (4),
29	six (6), and eight (8), and all transfer students shall receive an eye and
30	vision screening. This requirement applies to public school and charter
31	schools. The Department of Education shall ensure the provision of all
32	general revenues necessary to access federal funds for eye and vision
33	screenings for all qualified federal healthcare program recipients. The
34	school district shall be responsible for all remaining costs associated with
35	eye and vision screenings. Nothing in this act shall preclude voluntary
36	screening of any educational grade or preclude the referral of any child

1	regardless of grade whom the teacher or school nurse feels should be screened
2	or examined. (2) The responsibility for the enforcement of this
3	section rests equally with each school district or charter school and the
4	parent or guardian of the child.
5	(b) An eye and vision screening shall include the following tests,
6	procedures, equipment, and instruments approved by the Arkansas Commission on
7	Eye and Vision Care of School Age Children and the Department of Education:
8	(1) Observation and external inspection of the eye;
9	(2) Distance visual acuity test using a Snellen Eye Chart at twenty
10	feet (20') or an age or developmentally appropriate chart at ten feet (10')
11	outside a vision screening instrument;
12	(3) A plus lens visual acuity test using a Snellen Eye Chart at twenty
13	feet (20') or an age or developmentally appropriate chart at ten feet (10')

17	(B) Vertical muscle balance test at far;

22	(c) A child who fails an eye and vision screening shall be rescreened

28	(2) The report shall identify whether the child passed or failed the

34	6-18-1302. Eye exams.
35	(a)(1) A child who does not pass the eye and vision screening tests,
36	except for the color perception test, shall be required to have a

1	comprehensive eye and vision examination conducted by an optometrist or
2	ophthalmologist within sixty (60) days of receipt of the vision screening
3	report identifying the need for the examination.
4	(2) The parent or guardian of the child shall be responsible for
5	ensuring that the child receives the appropriate eye and vision examination.
6	(b) If a child does not receive an appropriate examination, as
7	evidenced by a certificate signed by an optometrist or ophthalmologist

20	(a) Standardized forms for eye and vision screening reports shall be
21	developed by the Department of Education in conjunction with the Arkansas
22	Commission on Eye and Vision Care of School Age Children and adopted by the
23	Department of Education in regulations promulgated under the Arkansas
24	Administrative Procedure Act, § 25-15-201 et seq.
25	(b) The standardized forms shall include:
26	(1) A screening form;
27	(2) A parent notification form;
28	(3) A doctor report form;
29	(4) A form to report the results of screening and examination;
30	<u>and</u>
31	(5) Any other forms deemed necessary by the commission.
32	(c) Every public school and charter school shall use the standardized
33	forms for eye and vision screening reports.

35	6-18-1304. Training.
36	The Department of Education, in conjunction with the Arkansas

1	Commission on Eye and Vision Care of School Age Children, shall adopt
2	regulations that establish standards for training school nurses to perform
3	eye and vision screenings.

5	6-18-1305. Reporting.
6	Each public school and charter school shall de-identify eye and vision
7	screening results as necessary to comply with privacy laws and report the
8	results by grade to the Department of Education and the Arkansas Commission
9	on Eye and Vision Care of School Age Children. The reports shall include the
10	following information:
11	(1) The number of children screened;
12	(2) The number of children rescreened;
13	(3) The number of children who did not receive an eye and vision
14	<pre>screening;</pre>
15	(4) The number of children referred for a comprehensive eye
16	examination;
17	(5) The number of children who failed the eye and vision
18	screening who did not receive a comprehensive eye examination; and
19	(6) The results of comprehensive eye examinations.

21	6-18-1306. Consultant.
22	Each school district is encouraged to select one (1) or more
23	optometrists or ophthalmologists to serve as nonpaid eye and vision care
24	consultants to provide advice and assistance with eye and vision screenings

27	SECTION 2. Uncodified Section 3 of Act 755 of 2003, concerning the
28	Arkansas Commission on Eye and Vision Care of School Age Children, is amended
29	to read as follows:
30	SECTION 3. Duties.
31	(a) The commission <u>Arkansas Commission on Eye and Vision Care of</u>
32	School Age Children shall:

 10 Council, and the House and Senate Interim Committees on Public Health,
 11 Welfare, and Labor <u>two (2) times per year</u>.
- 12 (c) The commission may accept any and all donations, grants of money,
 13 instruments, equipment, supplies, materials, and services, conditional or
 14 otherwise from private sources, from municipal and county governments, from
 15 the state, and from the federal government. The commission may use any of
 16 its resources to further the commission's purposes and functions.
 - (d) The commission shall develop criteria for the distribution of commission resources to individuals and school districts in need of financial or other assistance necessary to satisfy the requirements of Arkansas Code §§ 6-18-1301 through 6-18-1306.
- 21 (e) In conjunction with the Department of Education, the commission
 22 shall develop criteria for passage or failure of a vision screening and
 23 criteria for referral for a comprehensive eye examination. The Department of
 24 Education shall adopt the criteria as rules promulgated under the
 25 Administrative Procedure Act, § 25-15-201 et seq.
 - (f) In conjunction with the Department of Education, the commission shall develop standardized forms to be used with regard to conducting and reporting the results of eye and vision screenings.
 - (g) The commission and the Department of Education shall evaluate and approve the vision screening instruments, equipment, and other testing items that are used to conduct the eye and vision screenings.
- 32 (h) The commission shall conduct a pilot study to evaluate the pre-33 and post-performance test scores of school children who have been screened 34 and referred for vision problems. The study shall encompass rural, urban, 35 and empowerment zone school systems.

1	SECTION 4. Uncodified Section 5 of Act 755 of 2003 is amended to read
2	as follows:
3	SECTION 5. The commission shall expire on June 30, $\frac{2005}{2007}$.
4	
5	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
6	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Commission on Eye
7	and Vision Care of School Age Children expires at the end of the current
8	state fiscal year; that the commission is called upon to undertake new
9	responsibilities with regard to eye and vision screenings for school age
10	children that cannot be completed within that time frame; that this act is
11	immediately necessary because any delay in the effective date of this act
12	would work irreparable harm on the ability of the commission to carry out its
13	responsibilities that are designed to benefit Arkansas school children and
14	enhance their learning opportunities. Therefore, an emergency is declared to
15	exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the
16	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
17	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
18	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
19	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
20	bill; or
21	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
22	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
