22	(a)(1) (A) All f	irearms which used in the commiss	sion of a crime that
23	come into the custody of any law enforcement agency in this state shall be		
24	delivered to the State Crime Laboratory within thirty (30) calendar days for		
25	ballistics testing.		
26	(B) (2) However, if the firearm is be	eing used as evidence
27	in a criminal case, th	en delivery shall take place with	hin thirty (30)
28	calendar days after th	e final adjudication of the crimi	inal proceeding.
29	(2) If it	would place an unreasonable bure	len on the law
30	enforcement agency to	transport the firearm to the labo	ə ratory, the person
31	responsible for delive	ry may contact the Department of	Arkansas State Police
32	and the department wil	l, if possible, accomplish delive	ery to the laboratory.

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I	(B) The tests $\frac{\text{shall}}{\text{may}}$ include, but not be limited to,		
2	firing the weapon and photographing <u>electronic imaging of</u> bullets and		
3	casings.		
4	(2) The laboratory shall coordinate with all participating		
5	agencies when investigations require the use of the National Integrated		
6	Bullet Identification Network's computer database.		
7	(3) The laboratory shall provide written analysis reports and		
8	experts for testimony when feasible.		
9	(4) After completion of the testing, the firearms shall be		
10	returned to the law enforcement agencies.		
11	(5) Within three (3) working days after completion of the		
12	testing, the laboratory shall send notice to the law enforcement agency from		
13	which it received the weapon that the testing has been completed.		
14	(6)(5) When the law enforcement agency regains possession of the		
15	firearm, the law enforcement agency shall immediately notify the owner,		
16	unless the owner is prohibited by law from possessing the firearm, that the		
17	owner may regain possession of the firearm at the offices of the law		
18	enforcement agency.		
19	(c) Law enforcement agencies in this state may request the assistance		
20	of the department <u>Department of Arkansas State Police</u> in tracing firearms.		
21	(d)(1) The department shall coordinate and participate in statewide		
22	enforcement programs connected with investigations intended to result in		
23	seizure of crime guns and the arrest of violators.		
24	(2) The department shall assist and coordinate with all law		
25	enforcement agencies involved in the tracing of firearms from the suspect		
26	back to sources.		
27	(e)(d) Firearms seized by the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission		
28	for violation of commission regulations are exempt from this section.		
29	(e) The State Crime Laboratory Board may adopt rules for the		
30	implementation of this section, including, but not limited to, rules		
31	regarding testing and submission procedures.		
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
