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1	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
2	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Assessment Coordination
3	Department needs to adopt and implement by rules final specifications for
4	computer assisted mass appraisal software; that the rules need to be in place
5	to protect counties conducting reappraisals; and that this act is immediately
6	necessary because delaying implementation would cause irreparable delays in
7	the proper assessments for property. Therefore, an emergency is declared to
8	exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the
9	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
10	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
11	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
12	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
13	bill; or
14	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
15	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
