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21	SECTION 1. (a) For the 2004-05 fiscal year, the amount of the State	<u>e</u>

23	departments under §§ 19-5-922 and 23-61-702 and Section 2 of Act 1583 of	
24	2003, is limited to one million dollars (\$1,000,000).

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31	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
32	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that this act places limits on	<u>the</u>
33	use of funds from the State Insurance Department Trust Fund for Fiscal Yea	<u>r</u>
34	2004-05 and transfers fund; that this act would be ineffective in	
35	accomplishing it purpose if the act became effective after this fiscal year	<u>r;</u>
36	and that this act is immediately necessary in order to accomplish the	

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1	purposes of this act. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this
2	act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
3	health, and safety shall become effective on:
4	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
5	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
6	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
7	bill; or
8	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
9	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
