For An Act To Be Entitled

10 AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL
11 SERVICES AND OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE OFFICE OF
12 THE GOVERNOR WHICH SHALL BE SUPPLEMENTAL AND IN
13 ADDITION TO THOSE FUNDS APPROPRIATED BY ACT 1030
14 OF 2005; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Subtitle

18 AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR
19 PERSONAL SERVICES AND OPERATING EXPENSES
20 FOR THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR
21 SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION.

24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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26 SECTION 1. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the Office of the
27 Governor the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to
28 be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such
29 purposes: four (4) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates
30 of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and
31 Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate
32 classification, which such positions shall be supplemental and in addition to
33 those positions authorized in Section 2 of Act 1030 of 2005.

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35 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated, to the Office of
36 the Governor, to be payable from the Constitutional Officers Fund, for



1 personal services and operating expenses of the Office of the Governor which
2 shall be supplemental and in addition to those funds appropriated in Section
3 3 of Act 1030 of 2005, the following:

10 SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
11 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
12 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
13 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
14 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
15 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
16 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
17 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
18 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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20 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
21 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
22 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
23 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
24 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
25 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
26 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
27 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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29 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
30 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
31 the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
32 effectiveness of this Act on the date of its passage and approval is
33 essential due to the call of the Governor for the convening of an
34 Extraordinary Session, that the provisions of this Act will provide
35 necessary positions and monies for the Office of the Governor to provide
36 essential governmental services for an Extraordinary Session, the delay in

1 the effective date of this Act beyond the date of its passage and approval
2 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of
3 essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared
4 to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the
5 public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and
6 after its passage and approval.

7 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
8 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
9 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
10 overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides
11 the veto.

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
