3	(2)(A) "Classroom teachers" means an individual who is:
4	(i) Required to hold a teaching license from the
5	Department of Education; and
6	(ii) Engaged directly in instruction with students in a
7	classroom setting for more than seventy percent (70%) of the person's
8	contracted time.
9	(B) The portion of contracted time a person is engaged in
10	his or her duties as a guidance counselor, librarian, math and literacy
11	coach, alternative learning environment director and staff, and summer and
12	after-school program staff shall be counted for purposes of subdivision
13	(a)(2)(A);
14	(3) "Building level principal" means any person who has
15	$\underline{\text{administrative responsibility for student instruction and discipline that is}$
16	limited to certain schools or buildings within the school district;
17	(4) "Federally-funded salary" means any portion of a school
18	district employee's salary and benefits paid from fund six (6) of the
19	Arkansas School and Educational Service Cooperative Financial Accounting
20	Manual; and
21	(5)(A) "Central office administrative expenses" means school
22	district administrative expenses assigned to any object code in function
23	codes in the Arkansas School and Educational Cooperative Financial Accounting
24	Manual designated by the department, such as those expenses in central office
25	administrative function codes 2111, 2121, 2131, 2141, 2151, 2211, 2216, 2221,
26	2300-2399, 2500-2599, 2610, 2710, and 2800-2899.
27	(B) No school district may change the object, function or
28	other code classification of such expenses which were previously designated
29	as a central office administrative expense, pursuant to this definition, as
30	of April 3, 2006, without first obtaining the written permission of the
31	department.
32	(b)(1)(A) Beginning with the 2006-2007 school year and each school
33	year thereafter, a school district's expenditures for central office
34	administrative expenses, salaries, and benefits for central office
35	administrators and their staff, regardless of the source of funds, shall not
36	exceed a percentage as provided in subdivision (b)(1)(C) of this section of

1	the sum of the district's actual	
2	total expenditures for the school year recorded in:	
3	(i) Fund one (1) of the teacher salary fund;	
4	(ii) Fund two (2) of the district's operating fund;	
5	<u>and</u>	
6	(iii) Fund four (4) of the district's debt service	
7	fund.	
8	(B) The maximum amount shall not be affected by any	
9	"transfers among fund codes.	
10	(C) The sum of a school district's actual total	
11	expenditures for central office administrative expenses, salaries, and	
12	benefits for central office administrative expenses, salaries and benefits	
13	shall not exceed:	
14	(i) For a school district with an average daily	
15	membership of five hundred (500) or fewer in the immediate prior school year,	
16	eight percent (8%);	
17	(ii) For a school district with an average daily	
18	membership between five hundred and one (501) and one thousand (1,000) in the	
19	immediate prior school year, seven and one half percent (7.5%);	
20	(iii) For a school district with an average daily	
21	membership between one thousand and one (1,001) and one thousand five hundred	
22	(1,500) in the immediate prior school year, seven percent (7%);	
23	(iv) For a school district with an average daily	
24	membership of one thousand five hundred and one (1,501) and two thousand	
25	(2,000) in the immediate prior school year, six and one half percent (6.5%);	
26	(v) For a school district with an average daily	
27	membership between two thousand and one (2,001) and ten thousand (10,000) in	
28	the immediate prior school year, five and one half percent (5.5%); and	
29	(vi) For a district with an average daily membership	
30	greater than ten thousand (10,000) in the immediate prior school year, five	
31	percent (5%)."

33	(2) The following expenditures are exempted from the limitations	
34	of subdivision (b)(1):	
35	(A) Any portion of a federally-funded salary; and	
36	(B) Any portion of salaries and benefits paid to a	

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1	classroom teacher or building-level principal.
2	(c) The Commissioner of Education may waive in writing the limitations
3	of subdivision (b)(l) of this section for any school district, provided:
4	(1) The superintendent and chair of the district's board of
5	directors submit a written request for a waiver; and
6	(2) The written request includes evidence of extraordinary
7	circumstances requiring the school district to exceed the limitations of
8	subdivision (b)(1) of this section.
9	(d)(1)(A) On or before December 15 of each school year, the Department
10	of Education and the Division of Legislative Audit shall file with the
11	Legislative Joint Auditing Committee a joint report identifying any school
12	district that violated the provisions of this section in the prior school
13	year.
14	(B)(i) The Division of Legislative Audit shall, before the
15	end of the school year that the report is received, conduct a review of each
16	school district listed in the Department of Education's report and issue a
17	follow-up verification report to the committee on the school districts that
18	violated the provisions of subdivision (b)(1) of this section.
19	(ii) The Division of Legislative Audit shall report
20	to the committee any other school district determined to be in violation of
21	subsection (b)(1) of this section when conducting annual audits of public
22	school districts.
23	(2) The committee shall require the superintendent and chair of
24	the board of directors of any school district identified in the report to
25	appear before the committee and provide an explanation and accounting of its
26	central office administrative expenses for the school year in which the
27	violation occurred.
28	(3) The Department of Education shall designate a school
29	district identified in the report as failing to comply with the best
30	financial management practices for school districts, as provided in § 6-15-
31	<u>2301.</u>
32	SECTION 2. (a) The provisions of this act shall not apply until
33	implemented by the Department of Education.
34	(b)(1) The provisions of this act shall not be implemented before July
35	<u>1, 2007.</u>

(2) At least sixty (60) days before implementing the provisions

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1	of this act, the department shall submit to the Legislative Council for
2	review a report identifying:
3	(A) The function codes classified by the Arkansas School
4	and Educational Cooperative Financial Accounting Manual as central office
5	administrative function codes;
6	(B) Data reflecting the percentage of actual total
7	expenditures that each public school district expended on the function codes
8	identified in subdivision (b)(2)(A) of this section in the prior school year;
9	<u>and</u>
10	(C) The identity of any school district that would have
11	been found to have violated the provisions of this act in the prior school
12	<u>year.</u>
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14	
15	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
16	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Supreme Court
17	found that the public school funding system continues to be inadequate and
18	the public schools are operating under a constitutional infirmity which must
19	be corrected immediately; and that the current amount of funding expended in
20	some districts on central office administration is unjustified and that a
21	limitation on these expenditures will result in an efficient use of state
22	funds. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being
23	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
24	become effective on:
25	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
26	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
27	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
28	bill; or
29	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
30	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
