10 the Presidents of Ouachita Baptist University and Henderson State University,
11 the President and Executive Secretary of the Arkadelphia Chamber of Commerce,
12 and at least an equal number of citizens of the Arkadelphia area to be
13 appointed by the members just named. The Commission shall be as broadly
14 based as possible to represent all the diverse interests and to represent
15 every race, gender, income level, and geographic area.

16 (b) The Commission shall have the following powers and duties:

17 (1) Determine the immediate needs of Arkadelphia and its surrounding
18 area;

19 (2) Determine the long-range needs and opportunities of the Arkadelphia
20 area;

21 (3) Seek and expend funds from all sources, both public and private;

22 (4) Coordinate the activities of the various federal, state, and local
23 agencies as well as the private sector in providing for the economic, social,
24 and physical needs of the area;

25 (5) To serve as the lead agency in the rebuilding and revitalization of
26 the Arkadelphia area;

27 (6) Adopt bylaws and establish goals; and

28 (7) Perform all other powers and functions necessary to fulfill its
29 duties.

30 (c) The Commission shall be subject to audit by the Division of Legislative
31 Audit.

32
33 SECTION 79. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. STATE'S
35 CONTRIBUTIONS. The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration
36 is authorized to transfer Appropriation and Funding between State's

1 Contributions line items authorized in Section 1. Any unexpended balances in
2 appropriation and funds provided for State's Contributions in this Act
3 remaining June 30, ~~2006~~ 2008, shall be carried forward during the fiscal year
4 ending June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

6 SECTION 80. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
8 PROCEDURES - PER DIEM MATCHING. If there is not sufficient appropriation,
9 from funds deposited in the State Treasury or Cash Accounts of an agency, for
10 personal services, or personal services matching for any state agency for the
11 biennial period ending June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009, for State agencies that process
12 payroll through the Arkansas Administrative Statewide Information System for
13 federal and state tax reporting as necessary to comply with the payment of
14 stipends under United States Internal Revenue Code (IRC), 2001-Code-Vol, Sec
15 3401 and Treasury Regulations §31.3401(c)-1(a) and §1.1402(c)-2(b), and
16 others which govern the reporting of income and payment of withholding and
17 matching taxes for personal services, the agency shall request a transfer
18 from appropriation provided for Personal Services and Personal Services
19 Matching in the appropriation for VARIOUS STATE AGENCIES - U.S. IRC AND
20 TREASURY REGULATIONS herein, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State,
21 stating clearly the amounts required for each item. Upon approval of the
22 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the State Auditor shall be notified as to
23 the amount and the purposes for which the appropriation is to be made and
24 such appropriation as needed shall be established upon the books of the
25 Department of Finance and Administration and the State Auditor. Provided,
26 however, that in the event the total amount of transfer requested in any
27 fiscal year exceeds Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), the Chief Fiscal Officer
28 of the State shall seek prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council or
29 Joint Budget Committee before the transfer shall be made.

33 SECTION 81. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. POSITION
35 ESTABLISHMENT. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall have the authority
36 to establish such positions as necessary for State agencies to process

1 payroll through the Arkansas Administrative Statewide Information System for
2 federal and state tax reporting purposes as necessary to comply with the
3 United States Internal Revenue Code (IRC), 2001-Code-Vol, Sec 3401 and
4 Treasury Regulations §31.3401(c)-1(a) and §1.1402(c)-2(b), and others which
5 govern the reporting of income and payment of withholding and matching taxes
6 for personal services. The positions established shall not be considered as
7 part of the total number of authorized positions for an agency and shall only
8 be considered as placeholders for payments to individuals who are board or
9 commission members or elected officials of the State that do not otherwise
10 receive salaries or wages as defined in §19-4-521 for their personal
11 services. Further, none of the positions established under this section
12 shall imply eligibility for state retirement of state health insurance
13 benefits. The establishment of such positions shall not exceed ~~1,000~~ 250
14 positions in any fiscal year.

16 SECTION 82. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
18 AUTHORIZED. The Arkansas Children's Hospital may request the Chief Fiscal
19 Officer of the State to transfer the sum of not to exceed \$1,000,000 each
20 fiscal year from the Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account from funds made
21 available by this Act for the Arkansas Children's Hospital Burn Center to the
22 Department of Human Service Grants Fund Account. The transferred funds shall
23 be used to match federal funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to
24 Arkansas Children's Hospital.

26 SECTION 83. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. Arkansas
28 Code § 12-75-114. Governor - Disaster emergency responsibilities is amended
29 to read as follows:

30

31 (a) The Governor is responsible for meeting and mitigating, to the maximum
32 extent possible, dangers to the people and property of the state presented or
33 threatened by disasters.

34 (b)(1) Under this chapter, the Governor may issue executive orders,
35 proclamations, and regulations and amend or rescind them.

36 (2) Executive orders, proclamations, and regulations have the force and

1 effect of law.

2 (c)(1) There is created within the office of the Governor a disaster
3 response fund, a disaster recovery fund, a catastrophic loss fund, and a
4 hazard mitigation fund, which shall be separate and apart from the Governor's
5 standard emergency fund.

6 ~~(2) The initial amount of the disaster response fund shall be in the
7 amount of one million dollars (\$1,000,000), the disaster recovery fund shall
8 be in the amount of three million dollars (\$3,000,000), and the hazard
9 mitigation fund shall be in the amount of three million dollars (\$3,000,000),
10 with:~~

11 ~~(A) The sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) from the disaster
12 recovery fund solely for use in individual assistance;~~

13 ~~(B) The sum of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) from the disaster
14 recovery fund solely for use in public assistance;~~

15 ~~(C) The sum of two million two hundred fifty thousand dollars
16 (\$2,250,000) from the hazard mitigation fund solely for use in hazard
17 mitigation assistance;~~

18 ~~(D) The sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) solely for use to
19 defray the cost of immediate emergency response; and~~

20 ~~(E) The sum of three million two hundred fifty thousand dollars
21 (\$3,250,000) from the catastrophic loss fund solely for use in catastrophic
22 losses suffered by both individuals and public entities.~~

23 (2) The initial amount of the disaster response fund shall be in the
24 amount of two million dollars (\$2,000,000), solely for use to defray the cost
25 of immediate emergency response.

26 (3) The disaster recovery fund shall be in the amount of five million
27 dollars (\$5,000,000), with:

28 (A) The sum of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) from the disaster
29 recovery fund solely for use in individual assistance; and

30 (B) The sum of three million dollars (\$3,000,000) from the disaster
31 recovery fund solely for use in public assistance.

32 (4) The hazard mitigation fund shall be in the amount of three million
33 dollars (\$3,000,000), solely for use in hazard mitigation assistance;

34 (5) The sum of three million two hundred fifty thousand dollars
35 (\$3,250,000) from the catastrophic loss fund solely for use in catastrophic
36 losses suffered by both individuals and public entities.

1 ~~(3)~~(6) The Governor's disaster fund may be increased from time to time at
2 the discretion of the Governor.

3 ~~(4)~~(7) Expenditures from the individual assistance and public assistance
4 funds may only be made in the event of a disaster as defined in § 12-75-
5 103(2) and only upon proclamation by the Governor.

6 ~~(5)~~(8) Expenditures from the emergency response fund shall be made by
7 executive order of the Governor, upon recommendation and verification by the
8 Director of the Arkansas Department of Emergency Management, and may only be
9 made to defray immediate costs associated with response activities by
10 emergency forces of state and local governments and private nonprofit forces
11 duly registered in accordance with § 12-75-127.

12 ~~(6)~~(9)(A) Expenditures from the hazard mitigation fund shall be made by
13 executive order of the Governor.

14 (B) The director shall establish and maintain a current hazard
15 vulnerability analysis of key critical public facilities eligible for
16 assistance under the Governor's hazard mitigation fund.

17 ~~(7)~~(10)(A) Expenditures from the catastrophic loss fund may only be made
18 in the event of a federally declared disaster, as well as a disaster as
19 defined in § 12-75-103(2), and only upon a separate proclamation by the
20 Governor that a disaster has occurred in which catastrophic losses have been
21 suffered by individuals or public entities in the state, or both.

22 (B) The director shall establish and maintain such criteria as are
23 necessary to administer the funds authorized for catastrophic loss.

24 (d)(1) During the continuance of any state of disaster emergency, the
25 Governor is Commander-in-Chief of all forces available for emergency duty.

26 (2) To the greatest extent practicable, the Governor shall delegate or
27 assign operational control by prior arrangement embodied in appropriate
28 executive orders or regulations, but nothing in this section restricts the
29 Governor's authority to do so by orders issued at the time of the disaster
30 emergency.

31 (e) In addition to any other powers conferred upon the Governor by law, the
32 Governor may:

33 (1) Suspend the provisions of any regulatory statutes prescribing the
34 procedures for conduct of state business, or the orders, rules, or
35 regulations of any state agency, if strict compliance with the provisions of
36 any statute, order, rule, or regulation would in any way prevent, hinder, or

1 delay necessary action in coping with the emergency;

2 (2) Utilize all available resources of the state government and of each
3 political subdivision of the state as reasonably necessary to cope with the
4 disaster emergency;

5 (3) Transfer the direction, personnel, or functions of state departments
6 and agencies or units thereof for the purpose of performing or facilitating
7 emergency services;

8 (4) Subject to any applicable requirements for compensation under § 12-
9 75-124, commandeer or utilize any private property if he or she finds this
10 necessary to cope with the disaster emergency;

11 (5) Direct and compel the evacuation of all or part of the population
12 from any stricken or threatened area within the state if the Governor deems
13 this action necessary for the preservation of life or other disaster
14 mitigation, response, or recovery;

15 (6) Prescribe routes, modes of transportation, and destinations in
16 connection with evacuation;

17 (7) Control ingress and egress to and from a disaster area, the movement
18 of persons within the area, and the occupancy of premises therein;

19 (8) Suspend or limit the sale, dispensing, or transportation of
20 alcoholic beverages, firearms, explosives, and combustibles; and

21 (9) Make provision for the availability and use of temporary emergency
22 housing.

23

24 SECTION 84. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
25 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
26 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
27 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
28 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
29 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
30 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
31 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
32 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

33

34 SECTION 85. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
35 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
36 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act

1 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
2 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
3 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
4 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
5 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

6
7 SECTION 86. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
8 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
9 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
10 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of
11 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
12 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
13 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the
14 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
15 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
16 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
17 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.
