5 (e) In addition to any other powers conferred upon the Governor by law, the

9 regulations of any state agency, if strict compliance with the provisions of  
10 any statute, order, rule, or regulation would in any way prevent, hinder, or

12 (2) Utilize all available resources of the state government and of each  
13 political subdivision of the state as reasonably necessary to cope with the  
14 disaster emergency;

15 (3) Transfer the direction, personnel, or functions of state departments  
16 and agencies or units thereof for the purpose of performing or facilitating  
17 emergency services;

18 (4) Subject to any applicable requirements for compensation under § 12-  
19 75-124, commandeer or utilize any private property if he or she finds this  
20 necessary to cope with the disaster emergency;

21 (5) Direct and compel the evacuation of all or part of the population  
22 from any stricken or threatened area within the state if the Governor deems  
23 this action necessary for the preservation of life or other disaster  
24 mitigation, response, or recovery;

25 (6) Prescribe routes, modes of transportation, and destinations in  
26 connection with evacuation;

27 (7) Control ingress and egress to and from a disaster area, the movement  
28 of persons within the area, and the occupancy of premises therein;

29 (8) Suspend or limit the sale, dispensing, or transportation of  
30 alcoholic beverages, firearms, explosives, and combustibles; and

31 (9) Make provision for the availability and use of temporary emergency

24 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.  
25 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being

27 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.
