12	ROY AND IN RECOGNITION OF HER MANY CONTRIBUTIONS
13	TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, THE STATE OF
14	ARKANSAS, AND HER LOCAL COMMUNITY.

18	TRIMBLE ROY AND IN RECOGNITION OF HER
19	MANY CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE UNITED STATES
20	OF AMERICA, THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, AND
21	HER LOCAL COMMUNITY.

24	WHEREAS, retired federal Judge Elsijane Trimble Roy of Little Rock,
25	Arkansas, died on Wednesday, January 24, 2007, at the age of ninety (90); and
26	
27	WHEREAS, Judge Roy was born in Lonoke, Arkansas, on April 2, 1916, to
28	Elsie and Judge Thomas Clark Trimble; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, Judge Roy graduated in 1934 from Lonoke High School in Lonoke,
31	Arkansas, as valedictorian; was a basketball and sports star while in high
32	school; was the women's singles tennis champion for two (2) years at the
33	University of Arkansas at Fayetteville; and graduated in 1939 from the
34	University of Arkansas School of Law, where she was the only female in the
35	graduating class; and

1	WHEREAS, Judge Roy was a long-time member of the First Baptist Church
2	of Lonoke and taught a women's Sunday school class while living in
3	Blytheville, Arkansas; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, Judge Roy practiced both public and private law in Lonoke,
6	Little Rock, and Blytheville, Arkansas; in 1966, became the first female
7	circuit judge in the state; in 1975, became the first female Arkansas Supreme
8	Court Justice; and in 1977, became the first female judge on the Eighth
9	Circuit Court of Appeals after being appointed by President Jimmy Carter; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, Judge Roy followed her father, Judge Thomas Clark Trimble to
12	the federal bench and presided in the same courtroom where her father served
13	for twenty (20) years; and retired from the federal bench in 1999 after
14	twenty-one (21) years; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, Judge Roy received numerous awards and honors through the
17	years, including her selection as Woman of the Year by the Business and
18	Professional Women's Club in 1969; was chosen Arkansas Democratic Woman of
19	the Year in 1979, an honor her mother also received; and received the
20	Outstanding Appellate Judge Award for 1976-1977 by the Arkansas Trial Lawyers
21	Association; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, Judge Roy was preceded in death by her parents; a brother,
24	Thomas Trimble; and a sister, Molly Verser; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, Judge Roy is survived by her son, Jim Roy and wife Bea of
27	Springdale, Arkansas; two (2) grandchildren, Allyson Roy Patrick and husband
28	Ashley of Fayetteville, Arkansas, and Tommy Roy and wife Christa of
29	Springdale, Arkansas; four (4) great-grandchildren; a brother, Walls Trimble
30	of Little Rock, Arkansas; a sister, Sue Measel of Birmingham, Alabama; and
31	many nieces and nephews; and

33	WHEREAS, the Senate of the Eighty-Sixth General Assembly wishes to
34	publicly recognize Judge Roy's contributions to the United States of America,
35	the State of Arkansas, and her local community,

1	NOW THEREFORE,
2	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
3	STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

5	THAT the Senate recognizes Judge Elsijane Trimble Roy's commitment,
6	hard work, dedication, and service to the United States of America, the State
7	of Arkansas, and her local community, and commends her for her leadership.

10	express sincere condolences to the family of Judge Roy, and upon adoption of
