10	CONGRATULATING THE WILKINSON FAMILY AND THE
11	FARMERS BANK BOARD OF DIRECTORS, OFFICERS, AND
12	STAFF ON ITS CENTENNIAL.

15	CONGRATULATING THE WILKINSON FAMILY AND
16	THE FARMERS BANK BOARD OF DIRECTORS,
17	OFFICERS, AND STAFF ON ITS CENTENNIAL.

20	WHEREAS, Farmers Bank of Greenwood, Arkansas, secured its state charter
21	on August 7, 1907, and opened for business on September 25, 1907, by founder
22	W. N. Wilkinson; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, Farmers Bank was established seven (7) years prior to the
25	establishment of the State Bank Department; its first deposit was thirty-
26	eight cents (\$.38); and on its first day of business, the bank earned a
27	profit of eighty-three cents (\$.83); and

29	WHEREAS, in 1907, founder W. N. Wilkinson was selected President of the
30	Greenwood School Board, a position he held until 1928; and
31	LHIEDEAC Formers Don't cognized the failed Cohestion County State Don't
32	WHEREAS, Farmers Bank acquired the failed Sebastian County State Bank
33 34	in Greenwood, Arkansas, in 1917; and
35	WHEREAS, even during the Great Depression days of moratoriums and
36	banking holidays, Farmers Bank had the distinction of never being placed on a
. •	really of really placed on a



restricted basis or being forced to declare a bank holiday; instead of 1 2 foreclosing on its customers, Farmers Bank simply held deeds until the 3 economy turned around and people could resume paying their notes; and Farmers 4 Bank was the only bank in Greenwood, Arkansas, to survive through the 5 difficult depression years; and 6 7 WHEREAS, in 1935, Farmers Bank acquired financially insolvent First 8 National Bank of Greenwood; and in 1938, Farmers Bank acquired the 9 financially troubled Hartford State Bank, making it the bank's first branch; 10 and 11 12 WHEREAS, in 1941, Means Wilkinson, Farmers Bank Vice President and Attorney, was elected Speaker of the Arkansas House of Representatives; in 13 14 1942, he entered the United States Navy in World War II and was wounded in 15 action during the Sicilian invasion and awarded the Purple Heart and two (2) 16 Bronze Star Medals; in 1953 he was named Farmers Bank Chairman and President 17 and he was elected President of the Greenwood School Board; and he also served on the Arkansas Board of Education, the Arkansas State Banking Board, 18 19 and the Arkansas Children's Colony; and 20 21 WHEREAS, in 1961, Farmers Bank established its second branch banking 22 location in the city of Hackett, Arkansas; and 23 24 WHEREAS, in 1968, a tornado devastated the community leaving the town 25 square in ruins; Farmers Bank suffered little damage and became the 26 headquarters for community leaders to begin planning the rebuilding of the 27 town; and the courthouse was completely destroyed, so court was held in the 28 Farmers Bank boardroom; and 29 30 WHEREAS, Farmers Bank President and Chairman Means Wilkinson was 31 elected to the Westark Community College Board of Directors, now University 32 of Arkansas at Fort Smith, in 1971; and he was named president of the 33 Arkansas Bankers Association; and 34 35 WHEREAS, in 1972, Betty Wilkinson was named president of Farmers Bank;

and in 1973, she became the first female bank president to graduate from

1	Southwestern Graduate School of Banking at Southern Methodist University; and

3	WHEREAS, in 1973, Farmers Bank established its third branch bank in the
4	town of Bonanza, Arkansas; and
5	
6	WHEREAS, in 1978, Betty Wilkinson, who held two (2) terms as a member
7	of the Arkansas State Banking Board, was nominated by Senator Dale Bumpers to
8 9	serve the cabinet position of Treasurer of the United States; and
10	WHEREAS, in 1985, Stanhope Wilkinson was named President of Farmers
11	Bank; and
12	zona, and
13	WHEREAS, though the 1980s marked a period of unprecedented bank mergers
14	and acquisitions, Farmers Bank remained committed to remaining a hometown
15	community bank; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, in 1990, Farmers Bank took over the branch of a failed savings
18	and loan branch in Greenwood, Arkansas; and in 1991, Betty Wilkinson was
19	named Chair of the Board of Farmers Bank; and
20	
21	WHEREAS, in 1991, Ed Wilkinson received a commission into the United
22	States Navy, following his father's footsteps; in 1994, he was named
23	President of Farmers Bank and Stanhope Wilkinson was named Chief Executive
24	Officer; and also in 1994, Ed Wilkinson followed his late father's footsteps
25	into the Arkansas House of Representatives; and
26	INTERESC in 1005. Formers Book satisfied the Control Charles Business in
27 28	WHEREAS, in 1995, Farmers Bank established the Center Street Branch in Greenwood, Arkansas, making it the second location in Greenwood and the
29	fourth branch location; and in 1996, the bank established the Fort Smith
30	Southside branch in Fort Smith, Arkansas, the bank's fifth branch and first
31	location in Fort Smith; and
32	
33	WHEREAS, in 1996, Farmers Bank attorney and board member Norman
34	Wilkinson was elected to served as Circuit/Chancery Judge for the 12 th
35	Judicial District; and
36	

1	WHEREAS, the years 1998-2007 marked a period of unprecedented growth
2	for Farmers Bank as a result of changing branch banking laws and the
3	information technology advancements; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, Farmers Bank has had, since its inception, an extraordinary
6	reputation for selfless contributions to the communities it serves; on June
7	20, 2000, during the 2000 Community Service Awards 23 rd Anniversary, Farmers
8	Bank was awarded the Corporate Humanitarian Award from KARK-TV, the Office of
9	the Governor, and Arkansas Division of Volunteerism; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, also in 2000, Farmers Bank established the Fort Smith Eastside
12	branch in Fort Smith, Arkansas, its sixth branch and second location in Fort
13	Smith, and Ed Wilkinson was elected to the Arkansas Senate; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, in 2005, Farmers Bank established its seventh branch in
16	Huntington, Arkansas, and its eighth branch in Mansfield, Arkansas; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, in 2006, Farmers Bank acquired Community National Bank's
19	Barling branch and converted it into Farmers Bank Barling Branch in May 2006,
20	becoming its ninth branch; also in 2006, Farmers Bank opened its tenth branch
21	location at Lavaca, Arkansas, on July 5, giving it a total of eleven (11)
22	locations; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, in 2007, the truly unique Farmers Bank celebrates its $100^{ m th}$
25	birthday; with two hundred million dollars (\$200,000,000) in resources, it is
26	still wholly owned and managed by the founding family; it operates under the
27	same leadership principles as it did when it was organized; and the board of
28	directors consists of Elizabeth "Betty" Wilkinson, Chair, widow of Means
29	Wilkinson; her sons Norman Wilkinson, Stanhope Wilkinson, and Ed Wilkinson;
30	their daughter Susan Wilkinson; and long-time employee and bank officer Tresa
31	Lowe; and
32	
33	WHEREAS, also in 2007, construction begins on the Farmers Centennial
34	Fountain, to demonstrate its commitment to the next century; and
35	THIRDDAG ALL G. A. CALL Dr. L. CALL G. T. A. L. T.
36	WHEREAS, the Senate of the Eighty-Sixth General Assembly congratulates

1	the Wilkinson Family and the Farmers Bank Board of Directors, officers, and
2	staff on its centennial and recognizes the Farmers Bank commitment to the
3	community,
