11	TECHNOLOGY REVIEW. The <u>Arkansas</u> Department of Health—and Human Services—
12	Division of Health shall seek approval of the state Chief Information Officer
13	and the review and advice of the Joint Committee on Advanced Communications
14	and Information Technology and the Chief Information Officer Council prior to
15	entering into any technology contract or technology project regarding the
16	appropriation for Information Technology Initiatives.
17	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2007}{}$

20	SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

22	CARE PROVIDERS - COMPENSATION, REQUIRED WITHHOLDING, FRINGE BENEFITS. The

24	discretion, is authorized to contract with intermittent Patient Care
25	Providers in order to provide services in the home. For all purposes, these
26	Patient Care Providers shall be considered independent contractors. The

- 1 OF FUNDS HOME HEALTH. The Disbursing Officer for the Arkansas Department of

SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 20 NURSING/DIRECT CARE EDUCATION STIPEND PROGRAM. Special provision for a 21 Nursing/Direct Care Education Stipend Program for the Arkansas Department of 22 Health (ADH) is hereby authorized to pay from funds appropriated in this Act. 23 This program is for eligible nursing students who are attending accredited 24 nursing institutions to become Registered or Licensed Practical Nurses. 25 The stipend is five thousand dollars (\$5,000) per person per year. Any 26 student who is awarded and accepts a stipend is under an employment 27 commitment to the ADH and is required to work in a full-time employee status 28 effective immediately upon graduation. The student employment commitment is 29 equal to the number of years the stipend was awarded and accepted. 31	(1) Training and use of automated external defibrillators; and

34	SECTION 27. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
35	by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
36	made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the

1	restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
2	Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
3	Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
4	control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
5	the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
6	strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

17	SECTION 29. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
18	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
19	appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
20	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2009 is essential to the operation of
21	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
22	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
23	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2009 could work irreparable harm upon the
24	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
25	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
26	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
27	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2009.
