It includes 10 the professional application of values, principles, and techniques to one (1) 11 or more of the following ends: 12 (A) Counseling with individuals, families, and groups; 13 (B) Helping people obtain tangible services; 14 (C) Assisting communities or groups; 15 (D) Providing or improving social and health services; and 16 (E) Engaging in alcoholism and drug abuse education and 17 prevention through the appropriate administration of alcoholism and drug 18 abuse counseling services; and 19 (4) "Registered clinical supervisor" means a person registered 20 by the State Board of Examiners of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors to 21 provide clinical supervision of applicants for certification or licensure; 22 and 23 (5) "Supervised work experience" means paid or voluntary work 24 experience as an alcohol and drug abuse counselor who provides alcohol and 25 drug abuse counseling services under the supervision of a credentialed 26 alcohol and drug abuse counselor to persons with alcoholism or other drug 27 dependency, or both. 28 29 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code §§ 17-27-408-17-27-411 are amended to read as 30 follows: 31 17-27-408. Alcoholism Licensed alcoholism and drug abuse counselor -
 - (1) Is at least twenty-one (21) years of age;

For national reciprocity, a 32 minimum of four thousand (4,000) hours is required. 33 (B) Supervised experience must shall be approved and 34 documented by a certified registered clinical supervisor in good standing 35 with the board;. 36 (13) Has successfully completed a minimum of three hundred (300)

- 1 hours of supervised direct counseling practicum. Supervised experience must
- 2 be approved and documented by a certified clinical supervisor in good
- 3 standing with the board. This practicum may be included in place of the
- 4 requirement in subdivision (a)(12) of this section of two (2) years'
- 5 experience; and
- 6 (14) Has successfully completed the written examination and oral
 7 examination for certification as a certified alcoholism and drug abuse
 8 associate.
 - (b) The certification shall be displayed in the associate's principal place of practice and shall entitle the individual to hold himself or herself forth to the public as providing services as authorized by this subchapter.
 - (c) Associates <u>certified</u> <u>licensed</u> by the board may engage in the practice of alcoholism and drug abuse counseling only while under the direct supervision of a licensed alcoholism and drug abuse counselor or other health professional licensed under other behavioral sciences or health boards and practicing alcoholism and drug abuse counseling after successfully completing a schedule of supervision prescribed by the board and performed under the direct supervision of a registered clinical supervisor in good standing with the board.

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- 21 17-27-410. Alcoholism Certified alcoholism and drug abuse technician 22 Certification requirements.
 - (a) The State Board of Examiners of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors shall issue the certification as a certified alcoholism and drug abuse technician to an applicant who meets the following requirements:
 - (1) Is at least twenty-one (21) years of age;
- 27 (2)(A) Has successfully completed a minimum of three (3) years 28 or six thousand (6,000) hours of supervised experience.
- 29 <u>(B)</u> Supervised experience <u>must shall</u> be approved and documented by a <u>certified registered</u> clinical supervisor in good standing 31 with the board;

 authorized by this subchapter.
 - (c) Technicians certified by the board may engage in the practice of alcoholism and drug abuse counseling only while under the direct supervision of a licensed alcoholism and drug abuse counselor or other health professional licensed under other behavioral sciences or health boards and practicing alcohol and drug abuse counseling who is registered as a registered clinical supervisor by the board.
 - (d) Technicians shall not receive a license as a licensed alcoholism and drug abuse counselor or a <u>certificate as a certified alcohol</u> <u>license as an associate alcoholism</u> and drug abuse <u>associate</u> <u>counselor</u>, unless the provisions of §§ 17-27-408 and 17-27-409 have been met.

1	(a) The State Board of Examiners of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse
2	Counselors shall issue the appropriate license or certificate to any person
3	who holds a current valid certification from the Arkansas Substance Abuse
4	Certification Board as a certified substance abuse counselor or other such
5	persons holding a valid license under other health or behavioral science
6	boards and practicing alcoholism and drug abuse counseling and who:
7	(1) Is in good standing with the State Board of Examiners of
8	Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors;
9	(2) Has submitted an application to the State Board of Examiners
10	of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors on a form provided by the board;
11	(3) Has paid to the State Board of Examiners of Alcoholism and

16	(b)(1) Except as provided in subdivisions (b)(2) and (3) of this

18	section unless that person has the required educational qualification as
19	required by this subchapter.
20	(2) Each person currently credentialed with a Certified Alcohol
21	and Drug Counselor designation from the Arkansas Substance Abuse
22	Certification Board who applies to the State Board of Examiners of Alcoholism
23	and Drug Abuse Counselors within sixty (60) days of August 13, 2001, and who
24	is in good standing shall be grandfathered as a licensed associate alcoholism
25	and drug abuse counselor.
26	(3) Each person currently credentialed with an Advanced Alcohol
27	and Drug Counselor designation from the Arkansas Substance Abuse
28	Certification Board who applies to the State Board of Examiners of Alcoholism
29	and Drug Abuse Counselors within sixty (60) days of August 13, 2001, and is
30	in good standing shall be grandfathered as a licensed alcoholism and drug
31	abuse counselor.
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33	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-27-413 is amended to read as follows:
34	17-27-413. License and certificate renewal — Fee — Waiver.
35	(a) Each licensed alcoholism and drug abuse counselor, certified
36	licensed associate alcoholism and drug abuse associate counselor, and

- 1 certified alcoholism and drug abuse technician shall:
- 2 <u>(1)</u> renew Renew his or her license or certificate every two (2)
- 3 years; and
- 4 (2) shall pay Pay the State Board of Examiners of Alcoholism and
- 5 Drug Abuse Counselors a renewal fee fixed by the board.
- 6 (b)(1) Renewal fees shall be waived for any licensee or person
- 7 certified actually serving in the armed forces of the United States.
- 8 (2) The A waiver under subdivision (b)(1) of this section shall
- 9 be effective for six (6) months following honorable discharge, separation, or
- 10 release from the armed forces, after which period a license or certificate
- 11 shall be considered lapsed.
- 12 (c) The board, at its discretion, may require continuing education as
- 13 a condition of license or certificate renewal.

- 16 license or certificate Appeals.
- 17 (a) The State Board of Examiners of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse
- 18 Counselors may hear the grievances of any person whose application for a
- 19 license, registration, or certificate has been denied.
- 20 (b) The board may deny, revoke, or suspend any license, registration,
- 21 or certificate upon proof that the person has willfully or repeatedly
- 22 violated any of the provisions of this subchapter or any rule or regulation
- 23 promulgated by the board or upon proof that a person has practiced outside
- 24 the scope of practice for which he or she is licensed or certified under this
- 25 subchapter.
- 26 (c) The board shall not suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew a license
- 27 or certificate, except after a hearing held before the board, upon notice to
- 28 the person charged.

- 32 place of the hearing; and

9	shall have the authority to issue subpoenas to compel the attendance of
10	witnesses and the production of documents and may administer oaths.
11	(2) The board may invoke the aid of the circuit court for the
12	county in which the hearing is held to enforce compliance with its subpoenas.
13	(g) A stenographic or mechanical record of the hearing shall be taken,
14	and a transcript shall be preserved by the board.
15	(h) At all hearings before the board, the Attorney General of the
16	State of Arkansas or one (1) of his or her assistants designated by him or
17	her shall appear and represent the board.
18	(i) The decision of the board shall be by a majority vote $\frac{1}{1}$
19	the board.
20	(j) A copy of the board's order shall be sent by certified mail to the
21	last known address of the person charged.
22	(k) The board may grant a rehearing when new and material evidence is
23	offered for its consideration.
24	(1) $\underline{(1)}$ Any person aggrieved by a final order of the board, within
25	thirty (30) days of the entry of the order, may appeal to the circuit court
26	of the county in which he or she resides.
27	(2) The appeal shall be determined by the court upon the
28	certified record, and $\frac{1}{100}$ new or additional evidence shall $\frac{1}{100}$ be heard or
29	considered by the court.
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
