## For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT POLICE CHIEFS ARE NOT  
DEPARTMENT HEADS FOR PURPOSES OF ARKANSAS CODE §  
14-42-110; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

TO PROVIDE THAT POLICE CHIEFS ARE NOT  
DEPARTMENT HEADS FOR PURPOSES OF  
ARKANSAS CODE § 14-42-110.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 14-42-110(b) and (c) concerning the  
appointment and removal of department heads are amended to read as follows:

(b)(1) City managers in cities having a city manager form of  
government shall have the power to appoint and remove all department heads.

(2) In cities with a city manager form of government and with  
civil service commissions, the civil service commission shall have the power  
to override the city manager's appointment or removal of the ~~police or~~ fire  
chief by a majority vote of the total membership of the commission.

(c)(1) ~~The provisions of this~~ This section ~~shall~~ does not apply to  
department heads not under the control of the governing body of the city and  
shall not apply to cities having a city administrator form of government.

(2)(A) This section does not apply to police chiefs.

(B) Police chiefs may be removed only for inefficiency,  
misconduct, or neglect of duty.

(C) In cities of the first class, cities of the second  
class, and incorporated towns, the city or town council by a two-thirds (2/3)



1 majority of the total membership of the council may vote to override the  
2 mayor's action under subdivision (c)(2)(B) of this section.

3 (D) In cities with a city manager form of government and  
4 with civil service commissions, the civil service commission may override the  
5 city manager's removal of the police chief under subdivision (c)(2)(B) of  
6 this section by a majority vote of the total membership of the commission.
