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27	WHEREAS, the 1991	Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficie	ncy Act		
28	(ISTEA) identified seven	ral high priority corridors of national si	gnifican	ce,

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32	WHEREAS, the total	l length of I-69, including all proposed c	onnector	s	
33	and the existing route	in Indiana and Michigan, is now approximat	ely two		
34	thousand seven hundred thirty (2,730) miles in length with an estimated cost				
35	between twenty billion o	dollars (\$20,000,000,000) and twenty-two b	illion		
36	dollars (\$22,000,000,000	0); and			

1 2 WHEREAS, to make the I-69 project more manageable, the states and the Federal Highway Administration have divided Corridors 18 and 20 into thirty-3 4 two (32) "Sections of Independent Utility", or "SIUs", that will function 5 independently even if the entire project is not completed; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the total estimated cost to construct approximately one 8 hundred eighty-five (185) miles of I-69 in Arkansas is two billion four 9 hundred million dollars (\$2,400,000,000); and 10 11 WHEREAS, the mileage for I-69 in Arkansas includes the route from Pine 12 Bluff to the Highway 278 connector, which is approximately thirty-nine (39) miles in length and Arkansas's portion of the Great River Bridge, which is 13 the I-69 Mississippi River crossing and is approximately sixteen (16) miles 14 15 in length; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the Great River Bridge near Arkansas City has been designed, the State Highway Commission has authorized the acquisition of the right-of-18 19 way, and if additional federal funding is made available, construction could begin immediately after the required United States Coast Guard permits are 20 21 obtained for this project; and 22 WHEREAS, early studies have shown that for every dollar invested in I-23 24 69, the economic benefits will be one dollar and fifty-seven cents (\$1.57), 25 which is a fifty-seven percent (57%) return on the investment; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation 28 Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) expires on September 30, 2009, 29 30 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-SEVENTH GENERAL 31 32 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN: 33 34 THAT the General Assembly recommends to the Congress of the United 35 States, the Arkansas Congressional Delegation, the President of the United 36 States, the Secretary of the Department of Transportation, and the Director

1	of the Federal Highway Administration that a significant portion of funding		
2	for transportation infrastructure be committed to complete construction of I-		
3	69 in Arkansas including the Great River Bridge.
