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26	WHEREAS, during the 2008 crop year, cotton prices increased to near

29	WHEREAS, also	during 2008, the price of crude oil elevated to recor	:d	
30	highs, resulting in	extremely high producer input costs, including seed,		
31	diesel, and fertili	zer; and		
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33	WHEREAS, cotto	on producers, acting prudently, hedged their positions	s by	
34	entering into forwa	rd contracts fixing the price of cotton for delivery;	and

36	WHEREAS duri	ng 2008 a well-known cotton huver filed for protection	nn	

1	under Chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code and ultimately rejected		
2	the forward contracts, forcing cotton producers to sell their cotton at		
3	prices significantly lower than originally booked, which resulted in losses		
4	approaching one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000); and		
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6	WHEREAS, as a result of the rejection of the forward contracts, cotton		
7	producers became "unsecured creditors" under the bankruptcy code; and		
8			
9	WHEREAS, the priority given to certain creditors in bankruptcy under 11		
10	U.S.C. § 507(a)(6) for the allowed unsecured claims of persons engaged in the		
11	production or raising of grain does not extend to cotton farmers; and		
12			
13	WHEREAS, 11 U.S.C. section 507(a) currently grants priority status to		
14	certain classes of unsecured creditors, including persons engaged in the		
15	production or raising of grain; and		
16			
17	WHEREAS, the losses suffered by Arkansas cotton farmers would have been		
18	mitigated if the United States Bankruptcy Code had extended priority status		
19	to producers of cotton,		
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21	NOW THEREFORE,		
22	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-SEVENTH GENERAL		
23	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
