22	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
23	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that certain provisions of the		
24	Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Act are badly in need of revision and		
25	updating to bring them into conformance with sound public pension policy;		
26	that such revision and updating is of great importance to members of the		
27	Arkansas Teacher Retirement System and to other citizens of the State of		
28	Arkansas; and that this act is immediately necessary in order to maintain an		
29	orderly system of benefits for the members of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement		
30	System. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being		
31	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall		
32	become effective on July 1, 2009.
