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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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21	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-20-603(i), concerning the funding for	
22	isolated schools, is amended to read as follows:	
23	(i)(1) Except as provided under $\S 6-20-604(g)$, A <u>a</u> school district	
24	eligible to receive isolated funding under this section shall continue to	
25	receive partial funding even if all or part of an isolated school is closed	1.
26	(2) If all or part of an isolated school in a school district	is
27	closed, the school district shall receive funding based on the prior year's	
28	three-quarter average daily membership of the isolated school or the part of	of
29	the isolated school that remains open.	
30	(3) The school district shall not receive funding under this	
31	subsection (i) if the closure is directed by the school district board of	
32	directors.	
33 34	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-20-604(c)(l), concerning eligibility of	f
35	an isolated school for special needs funding, is amended to read as follows	
36	(1) School facilities open for serving students in any grade i	

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1	kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12), in $\frac{1}{2}$ in $\frac{1}{2}$ one (1) or more isolated
2	schools meeting the requirements of subsection (b) of this section;
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4	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-20-604(g)-(h), concerning certain special
5	needs funding for isolated schools are amended to read as follows:
6	(g)(1) A school district eligible for special needs funding under this
7	section shall continue to be eligible to receive isolated school funding
8	provided under § 6-20-603 but shall only receive funding under one (1) of the
9	categories established under subsections (c)-(f) of this section When an
10	isolated school that receives funding under § 6-20-603(c)-(f) or under this
11	section is closed due to the affected school district's consolidation or
12	annexation, that funding shall continue and shall be paid to the receiving
13	school district in the consolidation or annexation that enrolls students from
14	the closed isolated school.
15	(2) The receiving school district may only use funds received
16	under this subsection (g) for the cost of transporting students previously
17	enrolled in the closed isolated school.
18	(h)(l) This section is contingent on the appropriation and
19	availability of funding for its purposes.
20	(2)(A) Undistributed funds under this section and § 6-20-603
21	allocated to a school district that is no longer eligible to receive the
22	funding shall be distributed on an equal basis per school district to each
23	remaining school district that is eligible to receive funds under subsections
24	(c)-(e) of this section.
25	(B) Funds distributed under subdivision (h)(2)(A) of this
26	section shall be used by the school district only for transportation costs of
27	the isolated schools in the school district.
28	(3)(2) Funding provided under this section is in addition
29	to and in excess of the amount of funds necessary to provide an adequate
30	education as required by the Arkansas Constitution and cannot be relied upon
31	beyond the 2007-2009 biennium expiration date of an appropriation made for
32	the purposes of this section.
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34	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
35	Assembly of the State of Arkansas that school districts that enroll students
36	in an isolated school or from a closed isolated school need funding for the

1	transportation of those students to and from the isolated area; that some
2	school districts may lose isolated school funding when an isolated school is
3	closed but continue to have the additional transportation costs; that the
4	loss of the funding may place a hardship on the school district involved; and
5	that this act is immediately necessary because school districts affected by
6	this act and the Department of Education need to resolve the funding issues
7	under this act before the beginning of the 2009-2010 school year. Therefore,
8	an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary
9	for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become
10	effective on:
11	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
12	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
13	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
14	bill; or
15	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
16	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
