# A Bill

SENATE BILL 880

## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE CONCERNING THE  
10 DEFINITIONS REGARDING PRIVATE RESIDENT AND  
11 CORRESPONDENCE SCHOOLS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

### Subtitle

14 TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE CONCERNING THE  
15 DEFINITIONS REGARDING PRIVATE RESIDENT  
16 AND CORRESPONDENCE SCHOOLS

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
20

21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-51-602(11)(B) concerning the definitions  
22 regarding private resident and correspondence schools is amended to read as  
23 follows:

24 (B) "School" also means any firm, partnership,  
25 association, corporation, or other form of business organization ~~which~~ that  
26 offers instruction in ~~flight or ground school to student fliers or~~ airframe  
27 or power plant mechanics;

29 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-51-603(9), concerning entities exempt  
30 from licensure as a private residence or correspondence school, is amended to  
31 read as follows:

32 (9) Flight instructors and flight instruction schools licensed  
33 under appropriate Federal Aviation Administration regulations and offering  
34 only training for a private pilot's license;

36 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-51-607(e)(3)-(4), concerning the Private



Career School Student Protection Trust Fund, is amended to read as follows:

(3) ~~Reimburse the Private Career Education Fund for Pay~~ expenses directly associated with the storage and maintenance of academic and financial aid records of those students adversely affected by school closings;

(4)(A) ~~Reimburse the Private Career Education Fund for Pay~~ administrative cost due to school closings, including, ~~but not limited to~~ without limitation:

- (i) Travel expenses; and
- (ii) The employment of temporary personnel to assist with transport and organization of student records.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-51-609(d), concerning an applicant for an admissions representative’s license, is amended to read as follows:

(d) An applicant for an admissions representative’s license must:

- (1) Be at least eighteen (18) years of age;
- (2) Be a high school graduate or hold a graduate equivalent degree;
- (3) Not have been convicted in any jurisdiction of a felony, ~~Class A misdemeanor~~ theft of property, or a crime involving an act of violence for which a pardon has not been granted;
- (4) Be a citizen of the United States;
- (5) Not have been discharged from the armed services of the United States under other than honorable conditions; and
- (6) Be in compliance with any other reasonable qualifications that the board may fix by rule.

SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-51-622(a), concerning non-commercial driver training instruction, is amended to read as follows:

(a) ~~Any A~~ A person teaching or instructing ~~persons~~ a person ~~under the age of eighteen (18)~~ seventeen (17) years of age or younger to drive a noncommercial motor vehicle or a motorcycle shall offer the minimum amount of driver training to ~~those student drivers~~ the student driver as prescribed by this section.

SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-51-622, concerning non-commercial driver

1 training instruction is amended to add an additional subsection to read as  
2 follows:

3 (e) The requirements for classroom driver training instruction for a  
4 motorcycle are:

5 (1) A minimum of five (5) hours of classroom instruction on  
6 driving techniques and rules of the road in Arkansas; and

7 (2) A minimum of ten (10) hours of actual motorcycle driving  
8 experience.
