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3	SECTION 13. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
4	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that this act is necessary to		
5	improve the operations of the Arkansas State Board of Massage Therapy, to		
6	improve the regulation of the massage therapy industry, and for the immediate		
7	protection of the public. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and		
8	this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public		
9	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
10	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
11	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
12	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
