15	WHEREAS, John Little McClellan was born February 25, 1896, in Sheridan,
16	Arkansas; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, Mr. McClellan began his legal education as a ten-year-old boy
19	by reading Blackstone's Commentaries on the Laws of England, and at age
20	seventeen (17) became the youngest lawyer in America by a special act of the
21	General Assembly in Arkansas; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, though Mr. McClellan had only recently commenced his practice
24	of law, Mr. McClellan answered the call of his nation soon after the
25	beginning of World War I by joining the Aviation Section of the U.S. Army
26 	Signal Corps in 1917 and serving as a first lieutenant; and

28	WHEREAS, after Mr. McClellan was honorably discharged from military
29	service in 1919, he resumed his law practice and his association with the
30	Democratic Party; served as city attorney for Malvern, Arkansas, and
31	prosecuting attorney for Hot Spring County, Arkansas; and was elected to
32	Congress in 1934 as a United States Representative, where he served two (2)
33 34	terms and supported President Franklin D. Roosevelt's New Deal; and
35	WHEREAS, after Representative McClellan's first unsuccessful bid for
36	the United States Senate in 1938 against incumbent Senator Hattie Caraway, he
, 0	the onitied beates behate in 1990 against incumpent behator hattie daraway, he

1	resumed his practice of law in Camden, Arkansas. He was successful in his
2	second Senate campaign in 1942, an achievement he would repeat five (5) more
3	times before his death in November 1977, making him the longest-serving
4	senator in Arkansas history; and
5	
6	WHEREAS, Senator McClellan's long tenure in office benefited his native
7	Arkansas, its people, and the nation as a whole, as he spearheaded many vital
8	and important projects, including flood and navigation control of the
9	Arkansas River following the Great Flood of 1927, securing passage of Title
10	III of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968, and the
11	Organized Crime Control Act of 1970, as well as legislation to strengthen the
12	Federal Rules of Evidence; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, Senator McClellan served for twenty-two (22) years as chair of
15	the Committee on Government Operations and as chair of the Senate Permanent
16	Subcommittee on Investigations, holding numerous hearings about subversive
17	activities in the United States Army Signal Corps; and

19	WHEREAS, as the ranking Democrat of the Committee on Government
20	Operations, Senator McClellan participated in the 1954 Army McCarthy
21	hearings, where he led a Democratic walkout to protest the improper
22	activities of then-chair Senator Joseph R. McCarthy, who was subsequently
