24	WHEREAS, the United States faces a shortage of physicians; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, Arkansas ranks $48^{ ext{th}}$ out of fifty (50) states in physicians per
27	capita so that the shortage of physicians in Arkansas is and will be greater
28	than that of the rest of the United States; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, medical schools in the United States are increasing their
31	student enrollments to increase the number of graduates; and
32	
33	WHEREAS, the Association of American Medical Colleges has recommended
34	an increase of thirty percent (30%) in the number of medical students by
35	2015; and

1 WHEREAS, graduates of medical schools must complete at least a 2 residency program in order to obtain a license; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is in the 5 process of increasing the enrollment in each medical school class from 150 to 6 200, requiring more residency positions in Arkansas; and 7 8 WHEREAS, graduates of medical schools must complete several years of 9 residency training to become board certified in their specialty areas, 10 including family medicine; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Accreditation Council on Medical Education reports that the number of residency positions in the United States has only increased 13 14 approximately eight percent (8%) in the last ten (10) years; and 15 16 WHEREAS, allowing the graduation of more medical students who must 17 compete with international medical graduates, graduates of schools of 18 osteopathy, and other smaller groups seeking residency training will not be 19 effective in alleviating the shortage of physicians in the United States unless additional residency positions are created and funding is increased to 20 21 cover their costs; and 22 23 WHEREAS, unless the number of residency positions in the Medicare 24 residency "Cap" system is raised or United States students have preferential 25 treatment in the match process, the increased number of medical school 26 graduates will be inadequate to resolve the shortage of physicians, 27 28 NOW THEREFORE, 29 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE 30 STATE OF ARKANSAS: 31 32 That the Senate recognizes it is essential to provide enough residency 33 positions for the number of medical school graduates in order to help relieve 34 the shortage of physicians practicing in the United States and urges the 35 Arkansas Congressional Delegation to aggressively initiate federal 36 legislative action that would increase the number of residency positions
