32 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMERGENCY 34 GRANTS & EXTRA HELP POOL. An Institution of higher education that suffers an 35 emergency/disaster event resulting in all or a significant portion of campus 36 operations being interrupted, may request disaster assistance through the

1 Arkansas Department of Higher Education. Upon the declaration of an 2 emergency by the Governor, the institution may request, subject to the recommendation of the Director of the Department of Higher Education and 3 4 approval of the Governor, a grant from the Disaster Relief Fund to assist in 5 returning that campus to operation and/or to a sister campus providing 6 services to the students from the affected campus. Certified law enforcement 7 officers employed by an institution of higher education may be granted 8 jurisdiction at the sister institution, upon agreement of both institutions. 9 The Department of Higher Education is authorized a pool of 500 extra help 10 positions for use in such emergency situations. These positions may be 11 assigned to the campus suffering the disaster event or to a sister campus 12 providing services to the students from the affected campus. The Governor may waive the 1,500 hour limit of ACA 6-63-314 on these assigned extra help 13 14 pool positions.

15 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2009
16 <u>2010</u> through June 30, 2010 <u>2011</u>.

SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 19 20 REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. Upon 21 determination by the president or chancellor of an institution of higher 22 education that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or 23 consolidation of administrative functions within the institution is necessary 24 for efficient and effective operations of the institution, the president or 25 chancellor, with approval of the institution's board of trustees, may have 26 the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between 27 campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of the institution, 28 after receiving prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 29 Committee. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used 30 for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General Assembly. The transfers, consolidations, or reorganizations which involve 31 32 academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education 33 prior to submission to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. 34 Provided, however, that the institution shall be limited to submitting no 35 more than two (2) individual transaction transfer requests during any fiscal 36 year and shall be further limited to no more than five percent (5%) of the

1 total General Revenue and Special Revenue appropriation, funding, positions 2 specific to each institution, and no Tobacco Settlement funds or appropriations may be reallocated pursuant to this section. 3 4 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 5 appropriation and general revenue funding for institutions of higher 6 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This 7 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation 8 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue 9 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that 10 11 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some 12 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate 13 14 that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of 15 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this 16 section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint 17 Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled 18 19 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is 20 void.

WORK 3 4 FORCE 2000 DEVELOPMENT FUND PROCEDURES. After the amounts to be made 5 available to the various technical colleges have been determined as set out 6 in Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2), such documents as may be necessary shall be 7 processed so that funds may be transferred from the Work Force 2000 8 Development Fund to the State Treasury fund or fund account from which the 9 technical college draws its general revenue support. Such funds as may be transferred shall not exceed 93.691% of the total funds available from the 10 11 Work Force 2000 Development Fund during the fiscal year. 12 In the event that a technical institute or comprehensive lifelong learning center which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund as 13 14 determined by law transfers or merges into the Arkansas Technical College and 15 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies 16 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force 17 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of 18 19 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2009 20 21 2010 through June 30, 2010 2011. 22 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 23 24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BUILDING MAINTENANCE FUND. After the sum of \$13,200,000 has been deposited into the 25 26 Higher Education Building Maintenance Fund, the next \$10,000,000 or so much 27 as is collected, is to be transferred to the Research Development Fund there

28 to be used as provided by law.
