9 AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL  
10 SERVICES AND OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE  
11 UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS FOR MEDICAL SCIENCES FOR  
12 THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2011; AND FOR  
13 OTHER PURPOSES.

16 AN ACT FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS  
17 FOR MEDICAL SCIENCES APPROPRIATION FOR  
18 THE 2010-2011 FISCAL YEAR.

22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
23

24 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for  
25 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2010-2011 fiscal  
26 year, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall  
27 be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation  
28 Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws  
29 amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific  
30 maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the  
31 provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons  
32 occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions  
33 of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-  
34 101), or its successor.

13 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for the  
14 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2010-2011 fiscal year,  
15 the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known  
16 as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes:  
17 six hundred twenty five (625) temporary or part-time employees, when needed,  
18 at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification  
19 and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate  
20 classification.

21

22 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE  
23 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA HELP -  
24 NATIONAL CENTER FOR TOXICOLOGICAL RESEARCH. There is hereby authorized, for  
25 the University of Arkansas Medical Sciences - National Center for  
26 Toxicological Research for the ~~2009-2010~~ 2010-2011 fiscal year, the following  
27 maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra  
28 Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: fifty-six  
29 (56), when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed the rate of pay for  
30 comparable positions authorized by this Act, and by the Uniform  
31 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, and all laws  
32 amendatory thereto.

33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~  
34 2010 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2011.

36 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE

1 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA HELP -  
2 UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL PRN POOL. There is hereby authorized, for the University  
3 of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-time or  
4 temporary positions, to be known as "PRN Extra Help", payable from funds  
5 appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing RN's and LPN's in a Nursing  
6 PRN Pool: four hundred ten (410), when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed  
7 the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this Act.

8 If the agency requests continuation of a "PRN Extra Help" position(s) as  
9 established herein during the next fiscal year, the extra help position(s)  
10 must be requested as a new extra help position(s) in the agency's budget  
11 request.

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~  
13 2010 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2011.

14  
15 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE  
16 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA HELP -  
17 UAMS TEMPS. There is hereby authorized for the University of Arkansas for  
18 Medical Sciences, the following number of part-time or temporary positions,  
19 to be known as "UAMS TEMPS/EXTRA HELP", payable from funds appropriated  
20 herein, for the purpose of employing qualified individuals in a UAMS  
21 Temporary Pool: Five hundred thirty (530), when needed, at rates of pay not  
22 to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this Act.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~

When overtime, shift differentials, standby pay, incentive pay and/or specialty differential are provided to employees as herein described, the total may exceed the line item maximum salaries for those positions as included in this Act. The positions of Patient Care Administrator, Associate Administrator, and Assistant Administrator of Patient Care as authorized in regular salaries-operations section of this Act shall be excluded from coverage of this Section. 13 Act which remains at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, not  
14 to exceed ten percent (10%) of funded appropriations, shall be carried  
15 forward and made available for the same purpose for the fiscal year ending  
16 June 30, 2011.

17 Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein,  
18 may be carried forward under the following conditions:

19 (1) Prior to June 30, 2010 the Agency shall by written statement set forth  
20 its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the Department of  
21 Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

22 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall  
23 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward by the  
24 September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting  
25 which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission or  
26 Institution and the amount of the funding carried forward, the program name  
27 or line item, the funding source and a copy of the written request set forth  
28 in (1) above;

29 (3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a written  
30 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee  
31 containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written  
32 statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose etc. for  
33 which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty (30)  
34 days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution presents  
35 its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget  
36 Committee; and



(4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall include all information obtained in item (3) above in the budget manuals and/or a statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution.

SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. STIPENDS. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is hereby authorized to pay stipends to students engaged in post-graduate clinical training in accredited programs of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, from "Regular Salaries" or "Maintenance and General Operation", as follows:

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~ 2010 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2011.

SECTION 33. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ADMISSION POLICY. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall admit one hundred fifty (150) freshman students in each fiscal year into the College of Medicine. Provided that no funds shall be expended to fund the positions of Chancellor, Dean of Medicine and any academic position until the Chancellor and Dean of Medicine certify to the Arkansas Legislative Council that the provision of this Section relating to the fiscal year requirement for one hundred fifty (150) freshman student admissions has been implemented.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~ 2010 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2011.

SECTION 34. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHAPLAIN

1 HOUSING ALLOWANCE. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical  
 2 Sciences may designate up to forty-five percent (45%) of the regular gross  
 3 salary (or stipend) of a minister or other clergy employed as a Chaplain or  
 4 appointed as a Chaplain Resident, as a housing allowance, to the extent used  
 5 by the person to rent or provide a home, according to the guidelines of the  
 6 Internal Revenue Service Code, Section 107 and the Arkansas Code 26-51-  
 7 404(b)(9).

8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~  
 9 2010 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2011.

10  
 11 SECTION 35. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. INDIGENT  
 13 CARE REIMBURSEMENT. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is  
 14 hereby authorized to utilize funds appropriated by this Act to extend  
 15 provisions of Act 688 of 1989 to authorize procedures for the disbursement of  
 16 Indigent Care maintenance and general operations appropriations to be paid  
 17 from cash funds of the institution, subject to reimbursement and correction  
 18 of reporting, as provided by Arkansas Code 19-4-1609.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~  
 20 2010 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2011.

21  
 22 SECTION 36. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
 24 ESTABLISHMENT OF A "GROWTH POOL". (a) The Arkansas Department of Higher  
 25 Education shall establish and maintain for the ~~2009-2010~~ 2010-2011 fiscal  
 26 year a pool of three hundred (300) nonclassified positions at a salary level  
 27 not to exceed ~~\$285,000~~ \$293,550. These positions are to be used by the  
 28 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal  
 29 services needs of the University during the ~~2009-2010~~ 2010-2011 fiscal year  
 30 exceed the number of positions allocated to the University by the  
 31 Legislature. The University shall provide justification to the Arkansas  
 32 Department of Higher Education for the need to allocate titles from this  
 33 "growth pool". No classifications will be assigned to the pool until such  
 34 time as specific positions are requested by the University, approved by the  
 35 University Board or their designee, and approved by the Legislative Council.  
 36 Furthermore, the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) of the Division of

1 Management Services of the Department of Finance and Administration shall  
 2 establish and maintain for the ~~2009-2010~~ 2010-2011 fiscal year a pool of  
 3 three hundred (300) career service positions up to a C130. These positions  
 4 are to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the  
 5 event that the personal services needs of the University during the ~~2009-2010~~  
 6 2010-2011 fiscal year exceed the number of positions in a classification  
 7 allocated to the University by the Legislature. The University shall provide  
 8 justification to OPM for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool".  
 9 No classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific  
 10 positions are requested by the University, recommended by OPM, and approved  
 11 by the Legislative Council.

12 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency  
 13 is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by  
 14 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and  
 15 the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly  
 16 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be  
 17 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.  
 18 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in  
 19 subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the  
 20 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary  
 21 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the  
 22 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative  
 23 Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of  
 24 approval by the Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section.  
 25 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled  
 26 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is  
 27 void.

28 If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as  
 29 established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be  
 30 requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~  
 32 2010 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2011.

33

34 SECTION 37. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHILD AND  
 36 FAMILY LIFE INSTITUTE. The Child Health and Family Life Institute shall be

1 administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas  
 2 Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or contract  
 3 with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics  
 4 for services required to deliver the programs of the Child Health and Family  
 5 Life Institute (CHFLI). Utilizing a multidisciplinary collaboration of  
 6 professionals, CHFLI shall provide a statewide effort to explore, develop and  
 7 evaluate new and better ways to address medically, socially and economically  
 8 interrelated health and developmental needs of children with special health  
 9 care needs and their families. CHFLI priorities shall include, but are not  
 10 limited to, wellness and prevention, screen and diagnosis, treatment and  
 11 intervention, training and education and research and evaluation. Arkansas  
 12 Children's Hospital and the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-  
 13 Department of Pediatrics shall make annual reports to the Arkansas  
 14 Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing programs and services  
 15 offered through CHFLI.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~  
 17 2010 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2011.

19 SECTION 38. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PARKING  
 21 FEES. On July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences  
 22 shall pay from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue,  
 23 the total amount appropriated for War Memorial Stadium Commission Parking  
 24 Services from Fees to the War Memorial Stadium Commission.

25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  
 26 ~~2007~~ 2010 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2011.

27

28 SECTION 39. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER  
 30 PROVISIONS. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship  
 31 Program Loans and/or Scholarships and the Community Match Student Loan and  
 32 Scholarship Program Loans and/or Scholarships have the goal of providing  
 33 primary care physicians in rural Arkansas, transfers may be made in such  
 34 amounts as are required between the line items made in the appropriation for  
 35 "Medical Loans and Scholarships".

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2007~~

1 2010 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2011.

2

3 SECTION 40. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CLINICAL  
5 EXPANSION AND RESEARCH POOL. (a) In order to address personnel needs emerging  
6 from expanding medical research and patient care issues and the necessity of  
7 recruiting and retaining qualified medical, research, and related support  
8 personnel, the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences or its successor  
9 is authorized for the ~~2009-2010~~ 2010-2011 fiscal year a pool of one thousand  
10 five hundred (1,500) "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions. These  
11 positions are to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences  
12 in the event that the personal services needs resulting from unanticipated  
13 clinical or research programs that are initiated during the ~~2009-2010~~ 2010-  
14 2011 fiscal year require additional positions, either in title, in  
15 classification, or in number, that are not authorized or contemplated by the  
16 General Assembly in Section 1 of this Act.

17 These "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions may also be used to  
18 properly classify positions when the University of Arkansas for Medical  
19 Sciences does not have a vacant position available with the appropriate  
20 title, grade, or salary level. The salary rates for these positions shall  
21 not exceed the highest maximum annual salary rate or the highest grade level  
22 position authorized by the General Assembly in Section 1 of this Act, as  
23 governed by the uniform Classification and Compensation Act of 1969, §21-5-  
24 201 et seq., or its successor.

25 (b) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is authorized to  
26 access the "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions authorized in  
27 this Section at any time during the fiscal year when it is determined by the  
28 Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, subject to the  
29 review and approval by the Board of Trustees, that the need for additional  
30 positions exists. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical  
31 Sciences shall provide a quarterly report detailing the justification of  
32 allocation of positions from this "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" to  
33 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, to the Department of Higher Education,  
34 and to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee for review.  
35 The report shall also include an accounting of the names, titles and salaries  
36 of personnel who have been employed in positions established from this pool

1 and the source and duration of funds associated with the positions.

2 (c) If the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences requests  
3 continuation of any "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" position(s) as  
4 established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be  
5 requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

6 (d) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency  
7 is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by  
8 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying job titles and the  
9 maximum grade or salary attached to those titles. The General Assembly has  
10 determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be  
11 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.  
12 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing a position pool in  
13 Subsection (a) of this Section and since the General Assembly has granted the  
14 agency broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and

22 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2009~~  
23 2010 through June 30, ~~2010~~ 2011.

24  
25 SECTION 41. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND  
27 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged  
28 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the  
29 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief  
30 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December  
31 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or  
32 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during  
33 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due.  
34 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the  
35 President or Chancellor, will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or  
36 upon release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief

1 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council accompanied by the  
2 Board approved published annual financial statement for the preceding fiscal  
3 year.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007  
5 2010 through June 30, ~~2009~~ 2011.

6  
7 SECTION 42. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized  
8 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds  
9 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the  
10 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and  
11 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
12 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures  
13 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this  
14 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of  
15 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied  
16 with in disbursement of said funds.

17  
18 SECTION 43. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly  
19 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained  
20 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act  
21 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations  
22 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by  
23 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral  
24 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or  
25 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

26  
27 SECTION 44. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
28 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the  
29 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
30 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2010 is essential to the operation of  
31 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
32 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the  
33 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2010 could work irreparable harm  
34 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
35 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
36 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health

and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2010.
