12	Correction of errors.
13	(a) <u>(l)</u> Should any If a change, omission, or error in the records <u>of</u>
14	<u>the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System</u> <del>result</del> <u>results</u> in a <del>member, a</del>
15	retirant, an annuitant, a beneficiary, or an alternate payee receiving
16	benefits or other distributions from the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System
17	benefit participant, employer, or the system having received an overpayment
18	or underpayment of any obligation, liability, contribution, or other right to
19	payment more or less than he or she what would have been entitled to receive
20	$\frac{1}{2}$ had paid or received if the records $\underline{had}$ been correct, the system or its
21	designee shall correct the error record and, as far as practicable, shall
22	adjust the <del>benefit, annuity, or refund payable to the person, his or her</del>
23	beneficiary, or his or her estate in the manner that the actuarial equivalent
24	of the benefit to which the person was correctly entitled shall be paid
25	obligation, liability, contribution, or other right to payment.
26	(2) A refund payable to a benefit participant shall be paid
27	based on the corrected record.
28	(3) The system may withhold an amount owed to the system from a
29	benefit participant to correct an overpayment made to the benefit
30	participant.
31	(b)(l) If a <del>person who is a member, a retirant, an annuitant, a</del>
32	beneficiary, or an alternate payee under a qualified domestic relations order
33	under § 9-18-101 et seq. benefit participant is paid any benefit or other
34	distribution by the system to which the <del>person</del> <u>benefit participant</u> is not
35	entitled; or the benefit participant or employer has an unpaid obligation to
36	the system, the system or its designee, under rules adopted by the Board of

(4) The Except for member contributions, the board or its 16 17 designee may waive adjustment or repayment due to the system, including 18 interest, if: 19 (A) The overpayment error was not the result of the 20 retirant's or the beneficiary's benefit participant's or employer's 21 intentional nondisclosure, fraud, misrepresentation, or other fault; and 22 (B) The board or its designee finds in his or her or its 23 sole discretion that recovery of the overpayment could be amount owed to the 24 system will result in a manifest injustice. 25 (c)(1) If the system calculates an amount to be owed to the system by 26 a member and, after notification to the member of the amount owed, determines 27 that the amount calculated is an error that would cause the member to owe a greater amount than the original amount calculated by the system, the system 28 29 may waive all or part of the interest calculation amount in error under rules 30 adopted by the board. 31 (2) In adopting rules under subdivision (c)(1) of this section. 32 the board shall only allow a waiver if: 33 (A) The error is not the result of the member's 34 nondisclosure, fraud, misrepresentation, or other fault; and 35 (B) Recovery of the amount owed to the system will result 36 in a manifest injustice to the member. A determination, review,

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1	administrative action, cause of action, request to enforce, change, or modify
2	an obligation, duty, benefit calculation, designation, refund, contribution,
3	service credit or other right arising under this subchapter shall not be
4	valid unless commenced within the look-back period unless the system
5	determines that the justification to commence the process is due to
6	intentional nondisclosure, fraud, misrepresentation, or criminal act.
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8	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
9	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that certain provisions of the
10	Arkansas Teacher Retirement System statutes are in urgent need of revision to
11	bring them into conformance with sound public pension policy; that finality
12	of decisions and calculations after four (4) fiscal years are needed to
13	better allocate system resources; that this revision is of great importance
14	to benefit participants and employers of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement
15	System and to other citizens of the State of Arkansas; and that this act is
16	necessary in order to maintain an orderly system of benefits for the members
17	of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System. Therefore, an emergency is
18	declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the
19	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective July 1, 2011.
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
