SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

- 1 PRIORITIES. High priorities of the Cossatot Community College of the
- 2 University of Arkansas shall be the development and implementation of
- 3 technical programs designed to: Cossatot Community College of the University
- 4 of Arkansas considers the following items HIGH PRIORITY and within the role
- 5 and scope of the college:
- 6 (1) upgrade skills of current employees in service area businesses and
- 7 industries, The recruitment of underserved populations in the CCCUA service
- 8 area, including but not limited to: Latinos, African Americans, Aging, and
- 9 Non-Traditional students,
- 10 (2) to combat illiteracy and English language deficiencies, The development
- 11 and offering of viable programs as defined by the Arkansas Department of
- 12 Higher Education and the deletion of programs which are not viable,
- 13 (3) to increase the number of skilled workers available for employments, The
- 14 <u>cultivating of relationships in the community that establishes more industry</u>
- 15 training and promotes economic development within the CCCUA service area,
- 16 (4) to provide leadership for school-to-work programs including cooperation
- 17 with area public schools, businesses, industries, and labor groups, and The
- 18 continued development of working relationships with area K-12 institutions to
- 19 provide concurrent enrollment, Advanced Placement, technical training, and
- 20 college readiness to these students,
- 21 (5) to provide the first two years of baccalaureate education transferable to
- 22 colleges and universities in the general community area of the College and
- 23 the State of Arkansas. The development of a comprehensive change in the way
- 24 the college prepares students for college-level work, including the
- 25 <u>development of special mastery learning programs within remedial math and</u>
- 26 English courses,

- 27 (6) The continued expansion of campus facilities to accommodate continued
- 28 record growth in credit and non-credit programs.
- 29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
- 30 2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012.
- 32 SECTION 6. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
- 33 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
- 34 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
- 35 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
- 36 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary

1	Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
2	Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
3	State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
4	Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
5	with in disbursement of said funds.
6	
7	SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
8	Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
9	contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
10	which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
11	Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
12	manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
13	summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
14	Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
15	
16	SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
17	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
18	appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
19	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2011 is essential to the operation of
20	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
21	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
22	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2011 could work irreparable harm
23	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
24	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
25	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
26	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2011.
