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36	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CL	AUSE. It is found and	d determined by the

1	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that high-level sex offenders			
2	oftentimes target young children as victims; that during the summer months,			
3	water parks are popular destinations for young children; and that this act is			
4	immediately necessary in order to have it effective before the late spring			
5	and summer of this year, when children will begin to go to water parks.			
6	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately			
7	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall			
8	become effective on:			
9	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;			
10	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,			
11	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the			
12	bill; or			
13	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is			
14	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.			
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
