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3	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
4	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the proper administration of		
5	county elections is essential to the people of this state; that there are		
6	certain areas in the state that need the ability to more efficiently operate		
7	county elections; and that this act is immediately necessary to ensure that		
8	all citizens of this state are properly represented. Therefore, an emergency		
9	is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the		
10	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective		
11	<u>on:</u>		
12	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
13	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
14	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
15	bill; or		
16	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
17	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
