1	(b) As used in this section, "institution of higher education" means a		
2	state-funded two-year or four-year college or university located in Arkansas.		
3	(c) The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board and the		
4	Department of Higher Education shall collaboratively develop accountability		
5	measures for each institution of higher education in Arkansas.		
6	(d) The board and the department shall analyze the information		
7	obtained from the accountability measures and compile an annual higher		
8	education performance report that includes without limitation for each		
9	institution of higher education:		
10	(1) Three-year graduation trend data presented in a format that		
11	allows parents to compare each school's graduation rates with state and		
12	national trends;
