21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
22

23 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - GENERAL OPERATIONS. There is hereby

9 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
10 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMERGENCY
11 GRANTS & EXTRA HELP POOL. An Institution of higher education that suffers an
12 emergency/disaster event resulting in all or a significant portion of campus
13 operations being interrupted, may request disaster assistance through the
14 Arkansas Department of Higher Education. Upon the declaration of an
15 emergency by the Governor, the institution may request, subject to the
16 recommendation of the Director of the Department of Higher Education and
17 approval of the Governor, a grant from the Disaster Relief Fund to assist in
18 returning that campus to operation and/or to a sister campus providing
19 services to the students from the affected campus. Certified law enforcement
20 officers employed by an institution of higher education may be granted
21 jurisdiction at the sister institution, upon agreement of both institutions.
22 The Department of Higher Education is authorized a pool of 500 extra help
23 positions for use in such emergency situations. These positions may be
24 assigned to the campus suffering the disaster event or to a sister campus
25 providing services to the students from the affected campus. The Governor
26 may waive the 1,500 hour limit of ACA 6-63-314 on these assigned extra help
27 pool positions.

28 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
29 ~~2010~~ 2011 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2012.

30

31 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
33 REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. Upon
34 determination by the president or chancellor of an institution of higher
35 education that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or
36 consolidation of administrative functions within the institution is necessary

1 for efficient and effective operations of the institution, the president or
2 chancellor, with approval of the institution's board of trustees, may have
3 the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between
4 campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of the institution,
5 after receiving prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
6 Committee. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used
7 for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General
8 Assembly. The transfers, consolidations, or reorganizations which involve
9 academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education
10 prior to submission to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.
11 Provided, however, that the institution shall be limited to submitting no
12 more than two (2) individual transaction transfer requests during any fiscal
13 year and shall be further limited to no more than five percent (5%) of the
14 total General Revenue and Special Revenue appropriation, funding, positions
15 specific to each institution, and no Tobacco Settlement funds or
16 appropriations may be reallocated pursuant to this section.

17 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
18 appropriation and general revenue funding for institutions of higher
19 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This
20 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation
21 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue
22 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the
23 Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that
24 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some
25 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad
26 powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate
27 that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of
28 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this
29 section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint
30 Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement
31 of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled
32 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is
33 void.

34 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
35 ~~2010~~ 2011 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2012.

36

1 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOANS. In
3 order to provide timely payments under financial aid appropriations made in
4 this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State is authorized to provide
5 loans from the Budget Stabilization Trust Fund to make available all funds
6 attributable to the financial aid programs under the then current official
7 revenue estimates. In the event of an unanticipated state revenue shortfall,
8 any such loans remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall be repaid from
9 revenues distributed in the first two months of the next fiscal year. Funds
10 for appropriations made in this Act for purposes other than financial aid
11 shall not be affected by the application of this provision.

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
13 ~~2010~~ 2011 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2012.

14
15 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. WORK
17 FORCE 2000 DEVELOPMENT FUND PROCEDURES. After the amounts to be made
18 available to the various technical colleges have been determined as set out
19 in Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2), such documents as may be necessary shall be
20 processed so that funds may be transferred from the Work Force 2000
21 Development Fund to the State Treasury fund or fund account from which the
22 technical college draws its general revenue support. Such funds as may be
23 transferred shall not exceed 93.691% of the total funds available from the
24 Work Force 2000 Development Fund during the fiscal year.

25 In the event that a technical institute or comprehensive lifelong learning
26 center which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund as
27 determined by law transfers or merges into the Arkansas Technical College and
28 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies
29 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force
30 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational
31 institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of
32 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund.

33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
34 ~~2010~~ 2011 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2012.

35
36 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BUILDING
2 MAINTENANCE FUND. After the sum of \$13,200,000 has been deposited into the
3 Higher Education Building Maintenance Fund, the next \$10,000,000 or so much
4 as is collected, is to be transferred to the Research Development Fund there
5 to be used as provided by law.

6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2010~~
7 2011 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2012.

8

9 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
10 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. REFUND TO
11 EXPENDITURES. Proceeds derived from the repayment of loans as authorized in
12 Items (02), (03) and (08) of Section 4 of this Act for the JR/SR Minority
13 Teacher Scholars, the Minority Masters Fellows and the State Teacher
14 Assistance Resource Program shall be deposited into the State Treasury fund
15 from which it originated.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
17 ~~2010~~ 2011 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2012.

18

19 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. NATIONAL
21 GUARD TUITION INCENTIVE PROGRAM. In addition to any other provisions of law,
22 any student who receives assistance from the appropriation made for the
23 "National Guard Tuition Incentive Program" in this Act shall repay any loans
24 and/or assistance if the student receives a discharge that is a less than
25 Honorable Discharge. Priority for funding shall be given to students already
26 receiving assistance from the National Guard Tuition Incentive Program.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,

32 SAVINGS BONDS. The Department of Higher Education shall adopt rules and
33 regulations for the allocation of the funds reappropriated for the
34 development of projects at State Institutions of Higher Education and the

36 Arkansas College Savings General Obligation Bonds Program to ensure that

17 CONTINGENCY APPROPRIATIONS - TRANSFERS AND REPORTS. (a) Upon approval by

20 contingency appropriation to any other appropriation made to the institution
21 from cash funds including the establishment of commitment items, and may
22 transfer appropriation from the contingency appropriation made payable from
23 each institution's State Treasury Fund to the state operations appropriation
24 made payable from each institution's State Treasury Fund including the
25 establishment of commitment items, and may transfer appropriation from the
26 contingency appropriation made payable from the Tobacco Settlement Program
27 Fund Accounts to any other appropriation made to the institution from Tobacco
28 Settlement Program Fund Accounts including the establishment of commitment
29 items.

30 (b) Contingency appropriation transfers shall only establish and

23 Education shall administer this program. The Arkansas Department of Higher
24 Education shall be authorized to expense costs associated with the

26 Education Grants Fund Account for the Student Undergraduate Research
27 Fellowship Program as authorized in Section 4 of this Act.

9 Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program.

11 SECTION 37. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 62,
12 Subchapter 3 is amended to add an additional section to read as

15 The following state-supported institutions of higher education
16 shall be exempt as allowed by §19-4-1415(b)(5) for construction
17 projects exceeding five million dollars (\$5,000,000) if they have
18 adopted policies and procedures in compliance with state law
19 involving the awarding and oversight of the contracts for design
20 and construction services:

22 (2) Southern Arkansas University – Magnolia;
23 (3) University of Central Arkansas;

28 SECTION 38. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter
29 62, Subchapter 1 is amended to add an additional section to read
30 as follows:

31 6-62-109. Annual certification of solvency.

32 (a) Annually, the board of trustees and the president or
33 chancellor of each state-supported institution of higher
34 education shall certify to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the state
35 and the Legislative Council that as of December 31, sufficient
36 appropriations and funds:

1 (1) Are available to meet all current and anticipated
2 obligations for the current fiscal year as the obligations become
3 due; or

4 (2) Will become available to meet all current and
5 anticipated obligations for the current fiscal year as the
6 obligations become due.

7 (b) The certification from each state-supported institution of
8 higher education shall be:

9 (1) Signed by the chair of the board of trustees and the
10 president or chancellor;

11 (2) Sent no later than February 28 or upon release of the
12 previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief Fiscal
13 Officer of the state and the Legislative Council; and

14 (3) Accompanied by the published annual financial
15 statement for the preceding fiscal year approved by the board of
16 trustees.

18 SECTION 39. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HIGHER
20 EDUCATION CENTRAL POOL POSITIONS. a) Universities - (1) The Department of
21 Higher Education shall establish and maintain a central pool of three hundred
22 (300) positions to be used to establish additional positions when an
23 institution does not have sufficient positions available to meet
24 unanticipated enrollment growth, industry training demands, and its mandated
25 responsibilities.
26 (2) Central pool positions are to be used by the institutions if the
27 personnel service needs exceed the number of positions authorized by the
28 General Assembly and that were not anticipated at the time of the passage of
29 the institution's operating appropriation act.
30 (3) No position established under this section may exceed the salary rate of
31 the highest maximum annual salary rate or the highest grade level position
32 authorized by the General Assembly in the requesting institution's operating
33 appropriation act.
34 (4) The institution shall provide justification to the Department of Higher
35 Education for the need to allocate positions from the central pool.
36 (5) Titles shall not be assigned to the institution from the central pool

1 until specific positions are requested by the institution and recommended by
2 the Department of Higher Education. The Director of the Department of Higher
3 Education shall provide a monthly report detailing the justification for the
4 allocation of positions from the pool to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
5 State and to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee for
6 review. The report shall also include an accounting of the titles or
7 classifications established from the central pool and the source of funds
8 associated with the positions.

9 (6) If an institution requests any central pool position to be continued
10 during the subsequent fiscal year, the position must be requested as a new
11 position in the institution's subsequent fiscal year budget request.

12 (b) Colleges - (1) The Department of Higher Education shall establish and
13 maintain a central pool of two hundred fifty (250) positions to be used to
14 establish additional positions when an institution does not have sufficient
15 positions available to meet unanticipated enrollment growth, industry
16 training demands, and its mandated responsibilities.

17 (2) Central pool positions are to be used by the institutions if the
18 personnel service needs exceed the number of positions authorized by the
19 General Assembly and that were not anticipated at the time of the passage of
20 the institution's operating appropriation act.

21 (3) No position established under this section may exceed the salary rate of
22 the highest maximum annual salary rate or the highest grade level position
23 authorized by the General Assembly in the requesting institution's operating
24 appropriation act.

25 (4) The institution shall provide justification to the Department of Higher
26 Education for the need to allocate positions from the central pool.

27 (5) Titles shall not be assigned to the institution from the central pool
28 until specific positions are requested by the institution and recommended by
29 the Department of Higher Education. The Director of the Department of Higher
30 Education shall provide a monthly report detailing the justification for the
31 allocation of positions from the pool to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
32 State and to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee for
33 review. The report shall also include an accounting of the titles or
34 classifications established from the central pool and the source of funds
35 associated with the positions.

36 (6) If an institution requests any central pool position to be continued

1 during the subsequent fiscal year, the position must be requested as a new
2 position in the institution's subsequent fiscal year budget request.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
4 2011 through June 30, 2012.

5
6 SECTION 40. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
7 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
8 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
9 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
10 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
11 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
12 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
13 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
14 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

15
16 SECTION 41. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
17 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
18 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
19 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
20 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
21 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
22 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
23 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

24
25 SECTION 42. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
26 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
27 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
28 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2011 is essential to the operation of
29 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
30 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
31 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2011 could work irreparable harm
32 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
33 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
34 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
35 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2011.
