SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMERGENCY GRANTS & EXTRA HELP POOL. An Institution of higher education that suffers an emergency/disaster event resulting in all or a significant portion of campus operations being interrupted, may request disaster assistance through the Arkansas Department of Higher Education. Upon the declaration of an emergency by the Governor, the institution may request, subject to the recommendation of the Director of the Department of Higher Education and approval of the Governor, a grant from the Disaster Relief Fund to assist in returning that campus to operation and/or to a sister campus providing services to the students from the affected campus. Certified law enforcement officers employed by an institution of higher education may be granted jurisdiction at the sister institution, upon agreement of both institutions. The Department of Higher Education is authorized a pool of 500 extra help positions for use in such emergency situations. These positions may be assigned to the campus suffering the disaster event or to a sister campus providing services to the students from the affected campus. The Governor may waive the 1,500 hour limit of ACA 6-63-314 on these assigned extra help pool positions.

SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. Upon

determination by the president or chancellor of an institution of higher

education that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or

consolidation of administrative functions within the institution is necessary

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,

- l for efficient and effective operations of the institution, the president or
- 2 chancellor, with approval of the institution's board of trustees, may have
- 3 the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between
- 4 campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of the institution,
- 5 after receiving prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
- 6 Committee. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used
- 7 for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General
- 8 Assembly. The transfers, consolidations, or reorganizations which involve
- 9 academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education
- 10 prior to submission to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.
- 11 Provided, however, that the institution shall be limited to submitting no
- 12 more than two (2) individual transaction transfer requests during any fiscal
- 13 year and shall be further limited to no more than five percent (5%) of the
- 14 total General Revenue and Special Revenue appropriation, funding, positions
- 15 specific to each institution, and no Tobacco Settlement funds or
- 16 appropriations may be reallocated pursuant to this section.
- 17 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of

- 15 <u>review. The report shall also include an accounting of the titles or</u>
- 16 classifications established from the central pool and the source of funds
- 17 <u>associated with the positions.</u>
- 18 (6) If an institution requests any central pool position to be continued
- 19 <u>during the subsequent fiscal year, the position must be requested as a new</u>
- 20 position in the institution's subsequent fiscal year budget request.
- 21 <u>The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,</u>
- 22 2011 through June 30, 2012.

- 24 SECTION 41. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
- 25 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
- 26 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
- 27 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
- 28 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
- 29 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
- 30 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
- 31 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
- 32 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

- 34 SECTION 42. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
- 35 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
- 36 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
