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34	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the

1	Scholars Program; that changes to the Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program		
2	ranking system are needed to ensure that awards are granted to the most		
3	qualified applicants; and that this act is immediately necessary to ensure		
4	that the Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program awards granted for the 2011-		
5	2012 school year incorporate the revised ranking criteria. Therefore, an		
6	emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for		
7	the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become		
8	effective on:		
9	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
10	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
