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2	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that certain provisions of the		
4	Arkansas Teacher Retirement System are in urgent need of revision and		
5	updating to bring them into compliance with sound public pension policy; that		
6	this revision is of great importance to members of the Arkansas Teacher		
7	Retirement System and to other citizens of the State of Arkansas; that the		
8	Arkansas Teacher Retirement System should not provide service credit for		
9	contract buyouts when services are not provided on-site to the employer to		
10	prevent undue costs from being passed on to the system by contract buyout		
11	participants obtaining vesting and service credit rights that otherwise would		
12	not be earned or payable; and that this act is immediately necessary because		
13	allowing inactive contract buyouts for service credit is poor public policy.		
14	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately		
15	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall		
16	become effective on:		
17	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
18	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
19	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
20	bill; or		
21	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
22	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
