- (b)(1) No An officer or employee shall not accept or receive, directly 3 4 or indirectly, any frank, pass, free ticket, or free service from any person, 5 firm, or corporation operating within the territorial limits of the city any 6 public transportation service, gas works, waterworks, electric light or power 7 plant, heating plant, telegraph line or telephone exchange, or other business 8 acting or operating under a public franchise of the city; nor shall any 9 officer or employee accept or receive, directly or indirectly, from any 10 person, firm, or corporation, or its agents, any other service upon terms 11 more favorable than those granted to the public generally.
  - (2) The prohibition of free transportation shall not apply to police officers or <u>fire fighters</u> <u>firefighters</u> in uniform; nor shall any free service to city officials heretofore provided by franchise or ordinance be affected by this subsection.
  - (c) Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and fined in a sum of not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) nor more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000), and every such contract or agreement shall be void.

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- General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the ability to utilize citizens as members of municipal boards, commissions, and task forces is essential to carrying out the functions of local government; that the restriction in this statute threatens the ability to attract citizen volunteers; and that this act is immediately necessary because of the dire need of municipalities to be able to use these volunteer citizens. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
- 31 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
- 32 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
  33 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
  34 bill; or
- 35 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
