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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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19	SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>Findings.</u>	
20	The General Assembly finds that:	
21	(1) The Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinica	.1
22	Health (HITECH) Act, enacted as part of the American Recovery and	
23	Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA), provides federal incentives for Medicare a	nd
24	Medicaid providers and hospitals to implement, adopt, and upgrade health	
25	information technology including electronic prescribing and electronic heal	th
26	record systems;	
27	(2) States are responsible for administering the incentive	
28	payments and have already begun embarking on their own health information	
29	technology initiatives; and	
30	(3) The United States Department of Health and Human Services	
31	recently released guidance encouraging states to pursue the implementation	of
32	health information technology as a key to driving down health care costs.	
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34	SECTION 2. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>Interim study - Electronic prescribing</u> .	
35	(a)(1) Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this act, th	<u>.e</u>
36	chair of the Senate Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor shall	



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1	create a Senate Electronic Prescribing Subcommittee and the chair of the
2	House committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor shall create the House
3	Electronic Prescribing Subcommittee.
4	(2) The chair of the Senate Committee on Public Health, Welfare,
5	and Labor shall appoint a chair of the Senate Electronic Prescribing
6	Subcommittee and the chair of the House Committee on Public Health, Welfare,
7	and Labor shall appoint a chair of the the House Electronic Prescribing
8	Subcommittee.
9	(3) The Senate Electronic Prescribing Subcommittee and the House
10	Electronic Prescribing Subcommittee shall meet jointly during the biennium
11	between the 2011 regular legislative session and the 2013 regular legislative
12	session.
13	(b) The Senate Electronic Prescribing Subcommittee and the House
14	Electronic Prescribing Subcommittee shall study the following aspects of
15	optimizing electronic prescribing systems:
16	(1) Best develop a neutral platform for the electronic
17	transmission of health data including without limitation:
18	(A) Medication history;
19	(B) Formulary status; and
20	(C) Other patient information health professionals
21	typically access when prescribing medication and other interventions;
22	(2) Ensure that prescribing decisions of practitioners at the
23	point of care are focused on patient safety and quality outcomes and attempts
24	to influence those decisions, through economic incentives or otherwise, are
25	<u>kept to a minimum;</u>
26	(3) Ensure that messages in electronic prescribing systems are
27	substantially supported by scientific evidence, accurate, up-to-date, and
28	fact-based, including a fair and balanced presentation of risks and benefits,
29	and support for better clinical decision-making, such as alerts to adverse
30	events and access to formulary information; and
31	(4) Establish a process to provide electronic prior
32	authorization request and approval transactions between providers and group
33	purchasers.
34	(c) The Senate Electronic Prescribing Subcommittee and the House
35	Electronic Prescribing Subcommittee shall develop and recommend policies
36	<u>that:</u>

1	(1) Seek to limit marketing in electronic health record systems;
2	(2) Seek to encourage the provision of evidence-based
3	information at the point of care; and
4	(3)(A) Standardize prior authorization to maximize
5	administrative simplification and efficiency.
6	(B) The Senate Electronic Prescribing Subcommittee and the
7	House Electronic Prescribing Subcommittee shall recommend a universal prior
8	authorization form to be made available for electronic use.
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10	SECTION 3. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>Report.</u>
11	On or before October 1, 2012, the Senate Electronic Prescribing
12	Subcommittee and the House Electronic Prescribing Subcommittee shall report
13	their findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation to the chair
14	of the Senate Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor and the chair of
15	the House committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor.
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17	SECTION 4. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>The Senate Electronic Prescribing</u>
18	Subcommittee and the House Electronic Prescribing Subcommittee expire on
19	December 31, 2012.
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
