8	TO RECOGNIZE AND COMMEND THE C.A.L.L. IN ARKANSAS FOR
9	ITS ACHIEVEMENTS AND SERVICES TO THE CHILDREN OF THE
10	STATE OF ARKANSAS IN THE FOSTER CARE SYSTEM.

14	TO RECOGNIZE AND COMMEND THE C.A.L.L. IN
15	ARKANSAS FOR ITS ACHIEVEMENTS AND
16	SERVICES TO THE CHILDREN OF THE STATE OF
17	ARKANSAS IN THE FOSTER CARE
18	SYSTEM.

20	
21	WHEREAS, the Children of Arkansas Loved for a Lifetime ministry, more
22	commonly known as the "The C.A.L.L.," is an unprecedented collaboration
23	between the Division of Children and Family Services of the Department of
24	Human Services and Arkansas Christian churches; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, Governor Mike Beebe stated in 2007 that a top priority of his
27	administration would be to improve the foster care system in Arkansas; and
28	
29	WHEREAS, The C.A.L.L. has garnered national attention because of its
30	grassroots-volunteer, low-cost model for recruiting, training, and supporting
31	foster and adoptive families and other volunteers to engage in caring for
32	children in the foster care system; and
33	
34	WHEREAS, The C.A.L.L.'s mission is to educate, equip, and encourage the
35	Christian community to provide a future and a hope to children in foster care
36	in Arkansas. The C.A.L.L.'s vision is to have no waiting children in foster



1 care in Arkansas, but instead to have waiting families ready to take them in; 2 and 3 4 WHEREAS, The C.A.L.L. model was developed first in Pulaski County in 5 2007 with the intention of replicating it in all seventy-five (75) counties 6 in Arkansas by engaging volunteers who are passionate about the plight of 7 children in foster care in their local community; and 8 9 WHEREAS, during the first three (3) years of its existence, The 10 C.A.L.L. launched local organizations in Arkansas, Benton, Cleburne, Conway, 11 Crawford, Faulkner, Fulton, Izard, Jefferson, Johnson, Lonoke, Ouachita, 12 Prairie, Pulaski, Saline, Sebastian, Sharp, Union, Washington, and White 13 Counties; and 14 15 WHEREAS, The C.A.L.L. raises awareness about children in foster care 16 and the need for a greater number of stable, loving foster and adoptive homes 17 to serve Arkansas children in foster care. More than five hundred (500) children in Arkansas foster care are currently available for adoption and 18 19 waiting for a "forever" family; and 20 21 WHEREAS, each year between six and seven thousand children spend time 22 in the Arkansas foster care system and only about nine hundred fifty (950) 23 foster families are available. Many children must be placed in emergency 24 shelters and residential facilities, or simply be moved from home to home, 25 causing Arkansas to have the second highest rate in the nation for placement moves of children in foster care; and 26 27 WHEREAS, since 2007, The C.A.L.L. has recruited more than six hundred 28 29 (600) families to serve as foster, adoptive, or respite care families for 30 children in foster care; and 31 32 WHEREAS, one hundred thirty-two (132) foster homes recruited by The C.A.L.L. are currently available to care for Arkansas's children in foster 33 34 care. One hundred thirty (130) adoptive homes recruited by The C.A.L.L. have 35 been certified statewide and are in the process of adopting a child from 36 foster care. Twenty five (25) respite family homes recruited by The C.A.L.L.

1	are headed by full-time foster parents. Two hundred thirty-six (236)
2	families recruited by The C.A.L.L. are in the process of being certified to
3	serve as foster, adoptive, or respite care homes; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, since 2008, more than fifty (50) children in Arkansas have
6	been adopted out of foster care and into a "forever" family. Since 2007,
7	more than six hundred eighty (680) Arkansas children have been welcomed into
8	loving foster and adoptive homes through The C.A.L.L.; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, in its first three (3) years, The C.A.L.L. mobilized more than
11	five hundred (500) volunteers who have spent more than 122,000 hours in
12	service to children in the foster system,
13	
14	NOW THEREFORE,
15	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
16	STATE OF ARKANSAS:
17	
18	THAT the Senate recognizes and commends the Children of Arkansas Loved
19	for a Lifetime, "The C.A.L.L.," for its loving service to the children of the
20	State of Arkansas in the foster care system, and praises its hard work and
21	dedication to respond to its own noble "call"!
