- 24 (6) Establish policies necessary for the operation of the home.
- 25 (f) The At the end of each fiscal year, the director shall, at the end
- 26 of each fiscal year, certify to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State the
- 27 amount of nonrevenues to be retained in the Miscellaneous Agencies Fund
- 28 Account. All other moneys shall be transferred to the General Revenue
- 29 Allotment Reserve Fund in accordance with according to existing laws.

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
