16	TO CHANGE THE LOCATION, USE, AND CAPACITY
17	OF THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS

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21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 20-81-105 is amended to read as follows:
24	20-81-105. Veterans' Home.
25	(a) The Department of Veterans' Affairs is authorized to establish and
26	maintain a Veterans' Home in the building formerly used as the Arkansas
27	School for the Blind and the Arkansas School for the Deaf at Twentieth and
28	Madison Streets in Little Rock, Arkansas at a location selected by the
29	Director of the Department of Veterans' Affairs, after seeking advice from
30	the Arkansas Veterans' Commission.
31	(b) The department is authorized to employ staff to operate the home
32	as it deems appropriate and as may be authorized by biennial appropriation.
33	(c)(l) The home shall be operated under the supervision of the
34	department.
35	(2) The Director of the Department of Veterans' Affairs <u>director</u>
36	shall be the administrative head of the home.



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1	(d)(l) The department shall promulgate appropriate guidelines for
2	determining eligibility of veterans for admission to the home, and the
3	monetary charges to be made for veterans residing in the home. All guidelines
4	shall conform to the federal requirements which must be met to qualify the
5	home as a nursing home and domiciliary for veterans and to render the home
6	eligible to receive federal financial assistance.
7	(2)(A) Notwithstanding the provisions of § 20-8-101 et seq., the
8	home may be converted to <u>used as</u> a nursing home and domiciliary for veterans
9	without obtaining a certificate of need therefor.
10	(B) Bed capacity will be limited to seventy (70), and no
11	beds shall be designated for Medicaid payment shall not exceed one hundred
12	<u>fifty (150)</u> .
13	(e) In the administering <u>administration</u> of the home, the director is
14	specifically authorized to do the following:
15	(1) Establish accounts to record the receipt and disbursement of
16	funds from resident veterans to pay for a portion of their maintenance at the
17	home;
18	(2) Develop policies for determining charges to be made to
19	resident veterans;
20	(3) Develop accounts and procedures pertaining to incompetent
21	residents of the home ;
22	(4) Establish procedures and accounts for payment by the home to
23	its residents for work performed at the home;
24	(5) Establish such other accounts as are necessary to the
25	orderly administration of the home; and
26	(6) Establish policies necessary for the operation of the home.
27	(f) The <u>At the end of each fiscal year, the</u> director shall , at the end
28	of each fiscal year, certify to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State the
29	amount of nonrevenues to be retained in the Miscellaneous Agencies Fund
30	Account. All other moneys shall be transferred to the General Revenue
31	Allotment Reserve Fund in accordance with <u>according to</u> existing laws.
