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30 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. 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16 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. REPORTING 18 REQUIREMENTS. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall annually file with 19 the Arkansas Legislative Council and the Joint Committee on Advanced 20 Communications and Information Technology a report summarizing all receipts 21 and expenditures made from the Unanticipated Services appropriation in this 22 Act.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2012
24 <u>2013</u> through June 30, 2014.

26 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 28 CONTINGENCY RESTRICTIONS. In the event of unforeseen conditions, additional 29 appropriations become necessary that are not authorized or contemplated in 30 Section 3 of this Act and such events make it necessary that the Department 31 of Information Systems receives additional appropriations to carry out the 32 objectives of the agency, the Director of the Department of Information 33 Systems is hereby authorized to request the approval of the Governor and the 34 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, as hereinafter provided, for transfer of 35 the additional appropriation provided the Department by Section 4, but in no 36 event shall the transfers exceed the appropriation provided in Section 4 of

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1 this Act. Whenever the Director of the Department of Information Systems 2 deems it necessary to establish additional appropriations as authorized 3 herein, a written report shall be filed with the Governor accompanied by 4 necessary supporting documents setting forth the facts, justifications, and 5 circumstances that necessitate such appropriation. Upon receipt of such 6 reports and supporting documents, the Governor, or his designee, shall study 7 the same, and if he shall determine that such additional appropriations are 8 being sought in strict compliance with this Act, the Governor, after seeking 9 prior review by the Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and 10 Information Technology, may approve or modify such request for additional 11 appropriations as in his judgment he deems necessary, and shall forward a 12 copy thereof to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State. Upon receipt thereof, 13 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State after receiving prior approval by the 14 Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee shall direct the State 15 Auditor to process said transfer upon his books in accordance with the 16 provisions as set out herein. If the agency requests continuation of 17 appropriation as established herein during the next biennium, the 18 appropriation must be requested as new appropriation in the agency's biennial 19 budget request.

20 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 21 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 22 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 23 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 24 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 25 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly 26 has determined that the Department of Information Systems may operate more 27 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Information 28 Systems authorizing broad powers under this section. 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SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

 REQUIREMENTS.

6 (a)(1) The Director of the Department of Information Systems will report
7 periodically to the Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and
8 Information Technology and the Executive Chief Information Officer regarding
9 the status of the Department of Information Systems' information technology
10 responsibilities in state government.

11 (2) The director will forward to the joint committee any statutory changes 12 that the department may recommend sufficiently in advance of the convening of 13 the session of the General Assembly.

14 (3) The director may report any factors that are outside the scope of the 15 department but are deemed to inhibit or to promote the department's 16 responsibilities.

17 (b)(1) By October 31, January 31, April 30, and July 31 of each fiscal 18 year, the Director of the Department Information Systems shall compile and 19 submit a report to:

20 (A) The Arkansas Legislative Council, if submitted between regular21 sessions of the General Assembly;

(B) The Joint Budget Committee, if submitted during a session of theGeneral Assembly; and

24 (C) The Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and Information25 Technology.

26 (2) The report shall:

(A) Detail all requests from state agencies, boards, and commissions for
advice regarding information technology planning, implementation,
installation, rates or fees, utilization of products, services, and
integrations or upgrades to be added to all existing technology plans; and
(B) Provide a full report of all corresponding recommendations made by the
Department of Information Systems to the requesting state agencies, boards,

33 and commissions.

34 (3) The report shall include:

35 (A) The name of the state agency, board, or commission requesting the 36 advice;

(B) The name and scope of the project for which advice is being sought;
 (C) The type of advice sought, for example: technical, product or service
 utilization, planning, implementation, installation, integration, or
 upgrades;

5 (D) A detailed explanation of all recommendations provided by the6 Department of Information Systems;

7 (E) How the recommendation fits into the information technology plan of 8 the agency, board, or commission;

9 (F) How the recommendation fits into the state's information technology 10 plan and shared technical architecture; and

(G) Other information as may be useful for policy making decisions by the
 Legislative Council or Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and
 Information Technology.

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SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 Compliance with State and Federal Regulations -

18 1. In order to effect compliance with the requirements of state and federal 19 statutory and regulatory provisions, the Director shall adjust billing rates 20 or issue billing adjustments to be federally compliant, notwithstanding the 21 provisions of ACA §25-4-105 and §25-4-119 or funds sufficient to effect 22 compliance shall be provided the Department from General Revenues, Special 23 Revenues or such other fund sources as may become available. These actions 24 shall be subject to the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and 25 approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council.

26 2. The Director shall have authority to transfer funds between the 27 Information Technology Reserve Fund established by ACA §25-4-123 and the 28 Department of Information Systems Revolving Fund established by ACA §25-4-121 29 for cash management purposes.

Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that the Department of Information Systems may operate more

1 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Information 2 Systems authorizing broad powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both 3 necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by 4 requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee 5 as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative 6 Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. 7 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 8 Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, 9 this entire section is void.

10 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2012
11 <u>2013</u> through June 30, 2014.

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SECTION 10. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 13 14 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 15 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 16 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 17 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 18 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 19 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 20 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 21 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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23 SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 24 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 25 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 26 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 27 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 28 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 29 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 30 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 31

32 <u>SECTION 12. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the</u> 33 <u>General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits</u> 34 <u>the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the</u> 35 <u>effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2013 is essential to the operation of</u> 36 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in

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1	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
2	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2013 could work irreparable harm
3	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
4	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
5	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
6	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2013.
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
