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22	SECTION 1. APP	ROPRIATION - GENERAL IMPROVEMENT - TECH	HNICAL INSTITUTES.

32	SECTION 2. DIS	BURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract ma	ay be awarded nor
33	obligations otherwise	e incurred in relation to the project o	or projects
34	described herein in	excess of the State Treasury funds act	ally available
35	therefor as provided	by law. Provided, however, that insta	itutions and
36	agencies listed here	in shall have the authority to accept a	and use grants and

- 1 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or
- 2 funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State
- 3 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects
- 4 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds
- 5 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General
- 6 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall
- 7 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.
- 8 (B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State
- 9 Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the
- 10 Revenue Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal control laws of
- 11 this State and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and
- 12 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in
- 13 disbursement of any funds provided by this act unless specifically provided
- 14 otherwise by law.

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- 16 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
- 17 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
- 18 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
- 19 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
- 20 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
- 21 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
- 22 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
- 23 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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- 25 <u>SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE.</u> It is found and determined by the General
- 26 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
- 27 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
- 28 effectiveness of this Act on the date of its passage and approval is
- 29 essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this
- 30 Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative
- 31 session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond the date of its
- 32 passage and approval could work irreparable harm upon the proper
- 33 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore,
- 34 an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the
- 35 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in
- 36 <u>full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.</u>

If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.
