2	(b) The General Assembly intends that the savings to the Arkansas		
3	Medicaid Program achieved under subsection (c) of this section shall be used		
4	to assist hospitals in Arkansas in meeting the healthcare needs of the		
5	hosptials' communities and the overall Medicaid healthcare cost.		
6	(c)(l) The Arkansas Medicaid Program shall recognize a qualifying		
7	advanced nurse practitioner as a primary care provider for all purposes.		
8	(2) Purposes under subdivision (c)(1) of this section include		
9	without limitation:		
10	(A) Being recognized as the initial health care provider		
11	in the federal and state Comprehensive Primary Care initiative payment model;		
12	(B) Initially diagnosing;		
13	(C) Being included as the patient contact for a team of		
14	family practice professionals and the patient-centered medical home;		
15	(D) Maintaining patient's records;		
16	(E) Ordering laboratory tests and records management as		
17	needed for patient care;		
18	(F) Providing preventive and periodic examinations within		
19	primary care;		
20	(G) Referring a patient when necessary to a physician, a		
21	specialist or a hospital; and		
22	(H) Treating a patient to the extent of the advanced nurse		
23	practitioner's scope of practice.		
24	(d)(1) The Arkansas Medicaid Program shall reimburse an advanced nurse		
25	practitioner not less than ninety percent (90%) of the physician		
26	reimbursement rate for services performed within the scope and licensure of		
27	the advanced nurse practitioner.		
28	(2) However, the Arkansas Medicaid Program shall reimburse an		
29	advanced nurse practitioner who performs services at a charitable clinic for		
30	which the advanced nurse practitioner does not pay a fee for a collaborative		
31	agreement with a physician not less than eighty-five percent (85%) of the		
32	standard reimbursement rate.		
33	(3) The Arkansas Medicaid Program shall reimburse an advanced		
34	nurse practitioner one hundred percent (100%) of the physician reimbursement		
35	rate for all out-of-pocket costs such as laboratory tests, x-rays, and tests		
36	ordered and performed.		

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1	(e)(1) The Arkansas Medicaid Program shall reimburse an advanced nurse
2	practitioner for services and costs performed within the scope and licensure
3	of the advanced nurse practitioner.
4	(2) The scope and licensure of the advanced nurse practitioner
5	shall be conclusively determined by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing
6	according to rules reviewed by the Legislative Council.
7	(f)(1)(A) For tax years beginning on and after January 1, 2013, there
8	is allowed an income tax credit against the income tax imposed by the Income
9	Tax Act of 1929, § 26-51-101 et seq., in the amount of one hundred dollars
10	(\$100) for each hour that a physician provides medical services at no cost to
11	a charitable clinic.
12	(B) However, the amount of the credit allowed under
13	subdivision (f)(l)(A) of this section shall not exceed five thousand dollars
14	(\$5,000) for each taxpayer per tax year.
15	(C) Under rules developed by the Department of Finance and
16	Administration, a charitable clinic may certify not more than two hundred
17	(200) hours per year per charitable clinic to physicians.
18	(2) The amount of the income tax credit under this subsection
19	that may be claimed by the taxpayer in a tax year shall not exceed the amount
20	of income tax due by the taxpayer.
21	(g) An insurance policy the premiums of which are paid directly or
22	indirectly by the Arkansas Medicaid Program also shall recognize and
23	reimburse an advanced practice nurse under subsections (c) and (d) of this
24	section.
25	(h) This section does not increase the scope of practice of an
26	advanced practice nurse.
