Definitions. 34 35 As used in this subchapter: 36 "Carry a handgun in public" means to carry a handgun either (1)

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1 openly or concealed in a public place that is not otherwise prohibited by 2 law; 3 (1)(2) "Concealed" means to cover covered from observation so as 4 to prevent public view; 5 (2)(3) "Convicted" means that a person having pleaded guilty or 6 nolo contendere to or was having been found guilty of a criminal offense; 7 (3) (4) "Handgun" means any firearm, other than a fully automatic 8 firearm, with a barrel length of less than twelve inches (12") that is 9 designed, made, or adapted to be fired with one (1) hand; and-10 (4)(5) "Licensee" means a person granted a valid license to 11 carry a concealed handgun pursuant to in public under this subchapter. 12 13 5-73-302. Authority to issue license. 14 (a) A license to carry a concealed handgun issued before the effective 15 date of this act is automatically converted to a license to carry a handgun 16 in public. 17 (a)(b) The Director of the Department of Arkansas State Police may 18 issue a license to carry a concealed handgun in public to a person qualified 19 as provided in this subchapter. 20 (b)(1) For new licenses issued after July 31, 2007, the license to 21 earry a concealed handgun is valid throughout the state for a period of five 22 (5) years from the date of issuance. 23 (2) After July 31, 2007, upon renewal, an existing valid license 24 to carry a concealed handgun shall be issued for a period of five (5) years. 25 (e)(1)(A) After July 31, 2007, a license or renewal of a license 26 issued to a former elected or appointed sheriff of any county of this state 27 shall be issued for a period of five (5) years. 28 (B)(c)(1) The A license to carry a handgun in public issued to a 29 former elected or appointed sheriff is revocable on the same grounds as other 30 licenses. 31 (2)(A) The A former elected or appointed sheriff shall meet the 32 same qualifications as all other applicants. 33 (B) However, the former elected or appointed sheriff is 34 exempt from the fee prescribed by 5-73-311(a)(2) and from the training 35 requirements of § 5-73-309(13) for issuance. 36 (d) A new license to carry a handgun in public issued after the

License - Issuance or denial. (a)(1)(A) The Director of the Department of Arkansas State Police may 35

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deny a license to carry a handgun in public if within the preceding five (5)

years the applicant has been found guilty of one (1) or more crimes of violence constituting a misdemeanor or for the offense of carrying a weapon. (B) The director may revoke a license to carry a handgun in public if the licensee has been found guilty of one (1) or more crimes of violence within the preceding three (3) years.

6 (2) Subdivision (a)(1) of this section does not apply to a
7 misdemeanor that has been expunged or for which the imposition of sentence
8 was suspended.

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1 continuously for ninety (90) days or longer immediately preceding the filing 2 of the application. 3 (B) However, subdivision (2)(A) of this section does not 4 apply to any: 5 (i) Retired city, county, state, or federal law 6 enforcement officer; or 7 (ii) Active duty military personnel who submit 8 documentation of their active duty status; 9 (3) Is twenty-one (21) years of age or older; 10 Does not suffer from a mental or physical infirmity that (4) 11 prevents the safe handling of a handgun and has not threatened or attempted 12 suicide; 13 (5)(A) Has not been convicted of a felony in a court of this 14 state, of any other state, or of the United States without having been 15 pardoned for the felony conviction and had firearms possession rights 16 restored. 17 (B) A record of a felony conviction that has been sealed 18 or expunged under Arkansas law does not render an applicant ineligible to 19 receive a concealed handgun license license to carry a handgun in public if: 20 The applicant was sentenced prior to March 13, (i) 21 1995; or 22 (ii) The order sealing or expunging the applicant's 23 record of a felony conviction complies with § 16-90-605; 24 (6) Is not subject to any federal, state, or local law that 25 makes it unlawful to receive, possess, or transport any firearm, and has had 26 his or her background check successfully completed through the Department of 27 Arkansas State Police and the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National 28 Instant Criminal Background Check System; 29 (7)(A) Does not chronically or habitually abuse a controlled 30 substance to the extent that his or her normal faculties are impaired. 31 (B) It is presumed that an applicant chronically and 32 habitually uses a controlled substance to the extent that his or her 33 faculties are impaired if the applicant has been voluntarily or involuntarily 34 committed to a treatment facility for the abuse of a controlled substance or 35 has been found guilty of a crime under the provisions of the Uniform 36 Controlled Substances Act, § 5-64-101 et seq., or a similar law of any other

1 state or the United States relating to a controlled substance within the 2 three-year period immediately preceding the date on which the application is 3 submitted; 4 (8)(A) Does not chronically or habitually use an alcoholic 5 beverage to the extent that his or her normal faculties are impaired. 6 (B) It is presumed that an applicant chronically and 7 habitually uses an alcoholic beverage to the extent that his or her normal 8 faculties are impaired if the applicant has been voluntarily or involuntarily 9 committed as an alcoholic to a treatment facility or has been convicted of 10 two (2) or more offenses related to the use of alcohol under a law of this 11 state or similar law of any other state or the United States within the 12 three-year period immediately preceding the date on which the application is 13 submitted; 14 (9) Desires a legal means to carry a concealed handgun in public 15 to defend himself or herself; 16 (10) Has not been adjudicated mentally incompetent; 17 (11) Has not been voluntarily or involuntarily committed to a 18 mental institution or mental health treatment facility; 19 (12) Is not a fugitive from justice or does not have an active 20 warrant for his or her arrest; 21 (13) Has satisfactorily completed a training course as 22 prescribed and approved by the director; and 23 (14) Signs a statement of allegiance to the United States 24 Constitution and the Arkansas Constitution. 25 26 5-73-310. Application form. 27 The application for a license to carry a concealed handgun in public 28 shall be completed, under oath, on a form promulgated by the Director of the 29 Department of Arkansas State Police and shall include only: 30 (1) The name, address, place and date of birth, race, and sex of 31 the applicant; 32 The driver's license number or social security number of the (2) 33 applicant; 34 (3) Any previous address of the applicant for the two (2) years 35 preceding the date of the application;

(4) A statement that the applicant is in compliance with

32 (a) The applicant for a license to carry a concealed handgun in public
33 shall submit the following to the Department of Arkansas State Police:
34 (1) A completed application, as described in § 5-73-310;
35 (2) A nonrefundable license fee of one hundred dollars (\$100);
36 (3)(A) A full set of fingerprints of the applicant.

Revocation. 9 (a)(1) A license to carry a concealed handgun in public issued under 10 this subchapter shall be revoked if the licensee becomes ineligible under the 11 criteria set forth in § 5-73-308(a) or § 5-73-309. 12 (2)(A) Any A law enforcement officer making an arrest of a 13 licensee for a violation of this subchapter or any other statutory violation 14 that requires revocation of a license to carry a concealed handgun in public 15 shall confiscate the license to carry a handgun in public and forward it to 16 the Director of the Department of Arkansas State Police. 17 (B) The license to carry a handgun in public shall be held 18 until a determination of the charge is finalized, with the appropriate 19 disposition of the license after the determination. 20 (b) When the Department of Arkansas State Police receives notification 21 from any law enforcement agency or court that a licensee has been found 22 guilty or has pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to pleaded guilty to or nolo 23 contendere to or been guilty of any crime involving the use of a weapon, the 24 license issued under this subchapter is immediately revoked. 25 (c) The director shall revoke the license to carry a handgun in public 26 of any licensee who has pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to or been found 27 guilty of an alcohol-related offense committed while carrying a handgun. 28 29 5-73-313. Expiration and renewal. 30 (a) Except as provided in subdivision (f)(1) of this section, the 31 licensee may renew his or her license to carry a handgun in public no more 32 than ninety (90) days prior to before the expiration date by submitting to 33 the Department of Arkansas State Police: 34 (1) A renewal form prescribed by the department;

35 (2) A verified statement that the licensee remains qualified 36 pursuant to the criteria specified in §§ 5-73-308(a) and 5-73-309;

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(3) A renewal fee of thirty-five dollars (\$35.00);

2 (4) A certification or training form properly completed by the

Rules and regulations.

Instructor review of applications. 6 (a) An instructor authorized to conduct a training course required by 7 this subchapter shall check the application of a student in the training 8 course for completeness, accuracy, and legibility. 9 (b) An instructor who repeatedly fails to comply with subsection (a) 10 of this section may have his or her license to conduct a training course 11 revoked. 12 5-73-319. Transfer of a concealed carry license to Arkansas. 13 14 (a) Any A person who becomes a resident of Arkansas who has a valid 15 license to carry a concealed handgun issued by a reciprocal state may apply 16 to transfer his or her license to Arkansas, which will become a license to 17 carry a handgun in public, by submitting the following to the Department of 18 Arkansas State Police: 19 (1) The person's current reciprocal state license; 20 (2) Two (2) properly completed fingerprint cards; 21 (3) A nonrefundable license fee of thirty-five dollars (\$35.00); 22 (4) Any fee charged by a state or federal agency for a criminal 23 history check; and 24 (5) A digital photograph of the person or a release 25 authorization to obtain a digital photograph of the person from another 26 source. 27 (b) After July 31, 2007, the A newly transferred license under this 28 section is valid for a period of five (5) years from the date of issuance and 29 binds the holder to all Arkansas laws and regulations rules regarding the 30 carrying of the concealed handgun. 31 32 5-73-320. Recognition of other states' concealed carry licenses. 8 (a) A person in possession of a valid license to carry a concealed 9 handgun issued to the person by another state is entitled to carry a 10 concealed handgun subject to the privileges and subject to the restrictions 11 prescribed by this subchapter if the state that issued the license to carry a 12 concealed handgun recognizes a license to carry a concealed handgun issued 13 under this subchapter. 14 The Director of the Department of Arkansas State Police shall: (b) 15 (1) Make a determination as to which states' licenses to carry 16 concealed handguns will be recognized in Arkansas and provide that list to 17 every law enforcement agency within the state; and 18 (2) Revise the list from time to time and provide the revised 19 list to every law enforcement agency in this state. 20 21 SECTION 4.
