- 7 (e)(b) The coordinating council shall assist community-based 8 prevention councils in planning and coordinating prevention activities, 9 promoting innovative programs, developing stable funding sources, and 10 disseminating current information. These local councils should be racially 11 balanced and shall include at least one (1) representative from each of the 12

- 17 (5) One (1) parent;

following groups:

- 21 (d)(c) The coordinating council shall develop training and education 22 programs for criminal justice personnel in drug-related matters in 23 conjunction with the Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy.
- 24 $\frac{(e)(1)}{(1)}(d)(1)$ The coordinating council shall have authority to develop 25 its rules of procedure to include the establishment of a committee structure 26 for the approval of funding and other purposes.
- 27 Committees shall include, but not be limited to, a 28 prevention, and education, and treatment committee chaired by the Director of 29 the Bureau of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention Director of the Division of 30 Behavioral Health of the Department of Human Services or his or her designee, 31 and a law enforcement committee.
- 32 (f) The coordinating council shall establish advocacy groups among the 33 business community and youth population of this state.
- 34 (g)(e) The coordinating council shall work with all federal, state, 35 county, and local law enforcement agencies to ensure an integrated system of 36 enforcement activities.

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(h)(f) The coordinating council shall perform other functions as may be necessary to carry out the functions, powers, and duties as set forth in this subchapter.
